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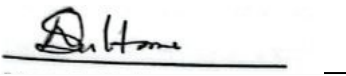
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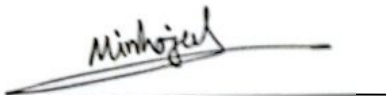
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ABSTRACT

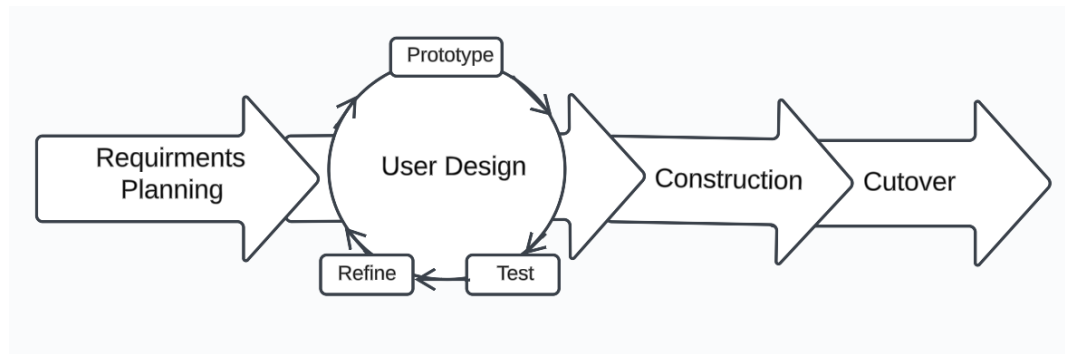


Figure 3.1.1: Methodology (SDLC model: Rapid Application Development)

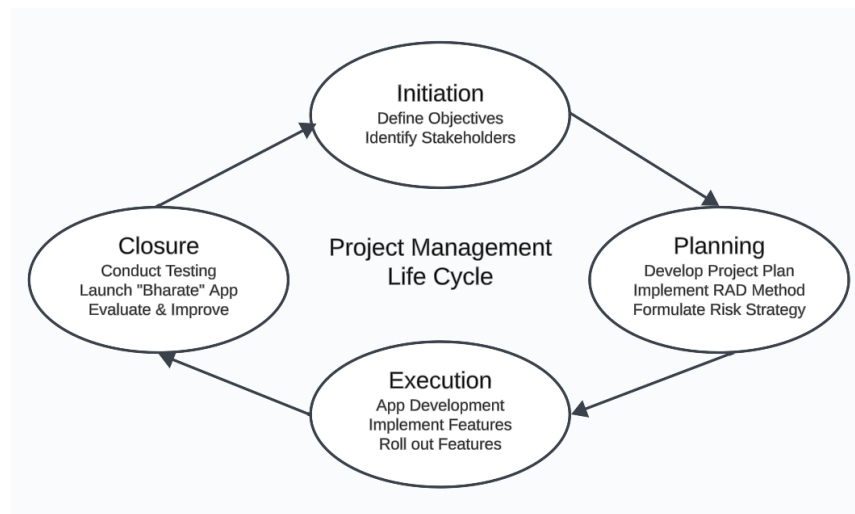


Figure 3.1.2: Project Management Life Cycle of “Bharate”.

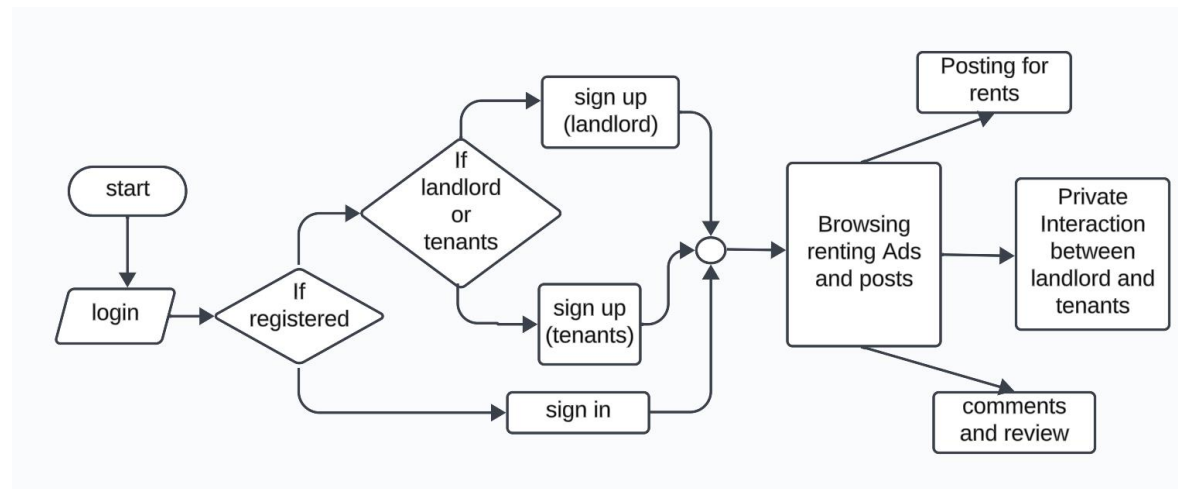


Figure 4.1.1: BPM Diagram of “Bharate”

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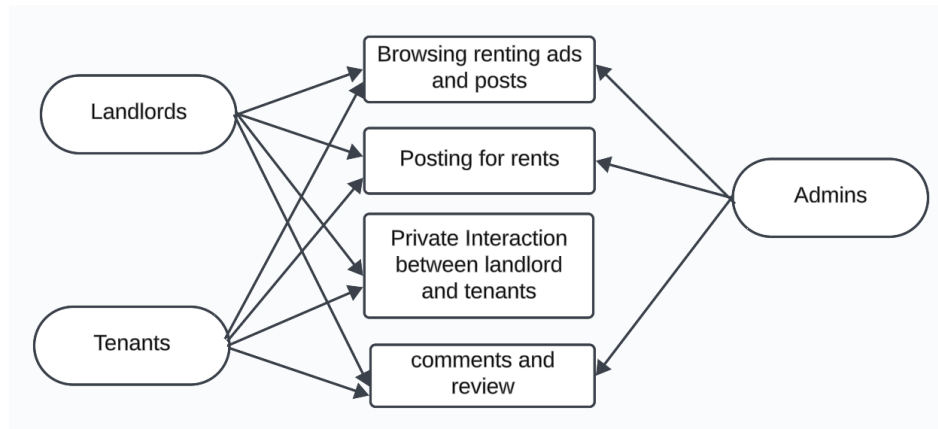


Figure 4.2.1: Use Case Diagram

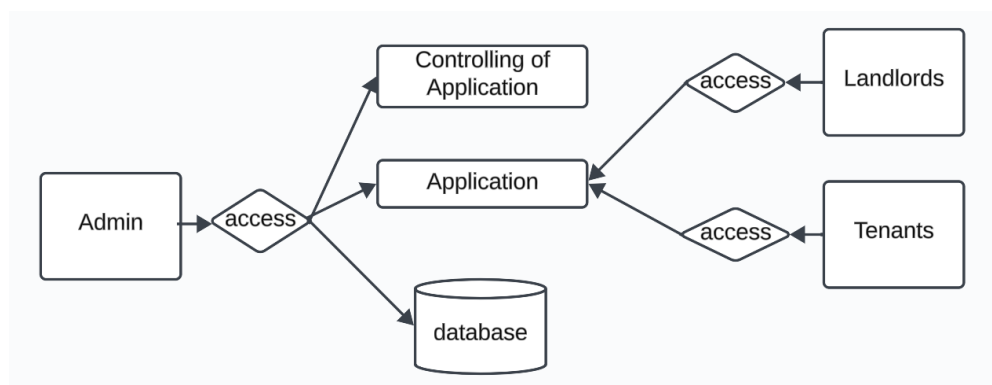


Figure 4.3.1: ERD Diagram (Only Entity to entity relationship)

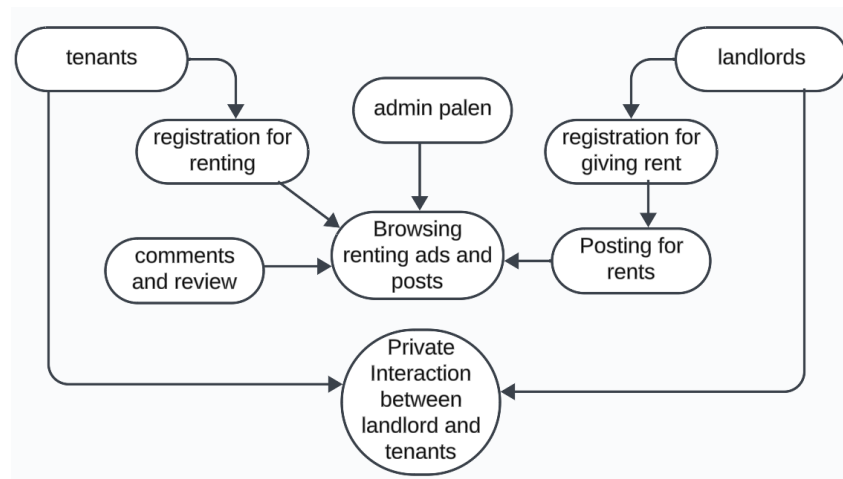


Figure 4.3.2: ERD Diagram (Entity to attributes relationship)

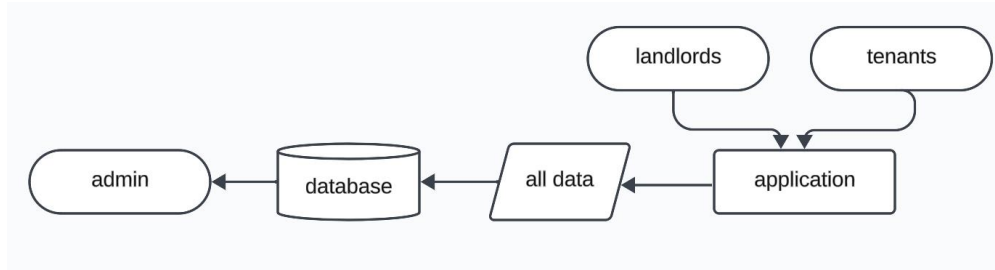


Figure 4.5.1: Logical Data Model

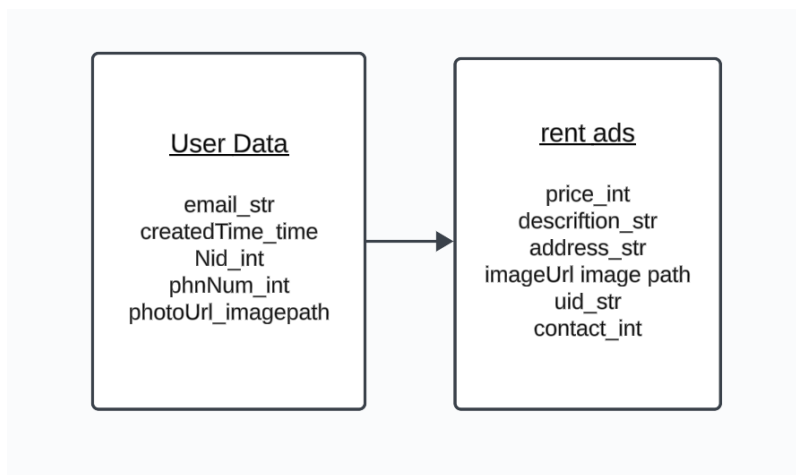


Figure 4.6.1: Relational Database Design

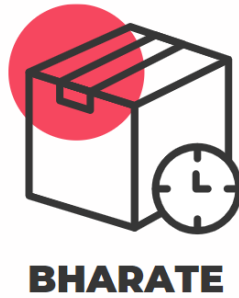


Figure 5.7.1.1: Logo of the app “Bharate”

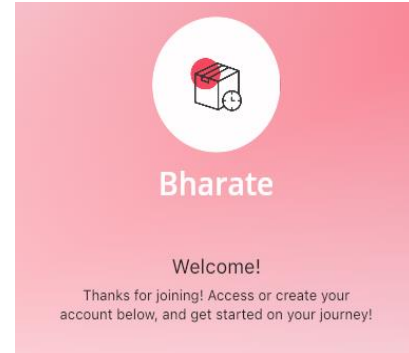


Figure 5.7.1.2: Splash of the app “Bharate”

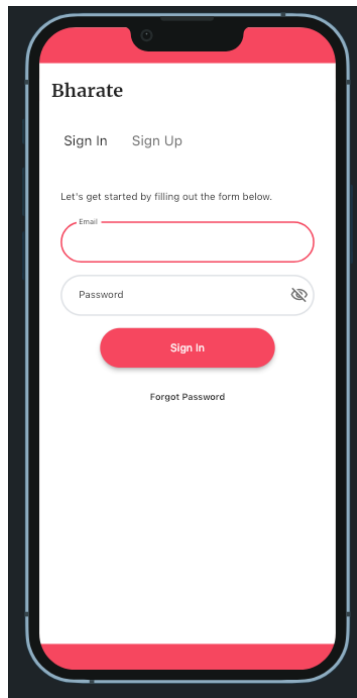


Figure 5.7.2.1: sign-in page of the app “Bharate”

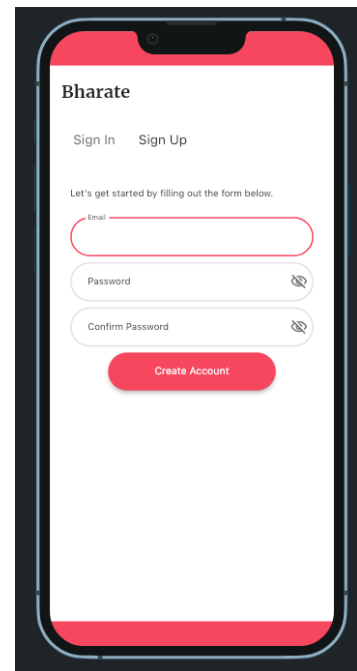


Figure 5.7.2.2: Sign-up of the app “Bharate”

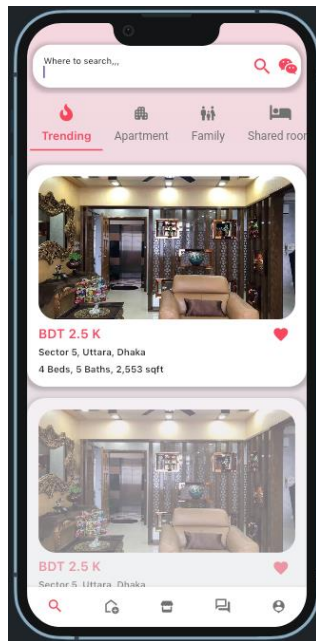


Figure 5.7.3.1: Home page

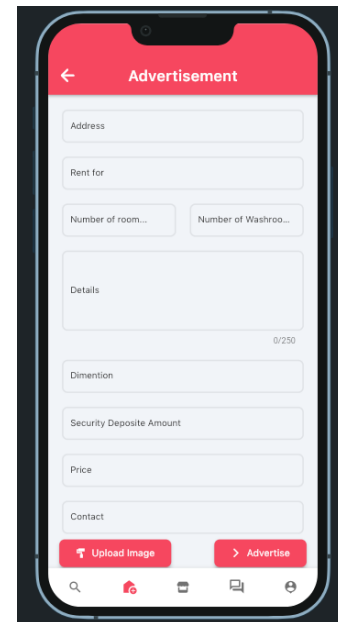


Figure 5.7.3.2: Advertisement page

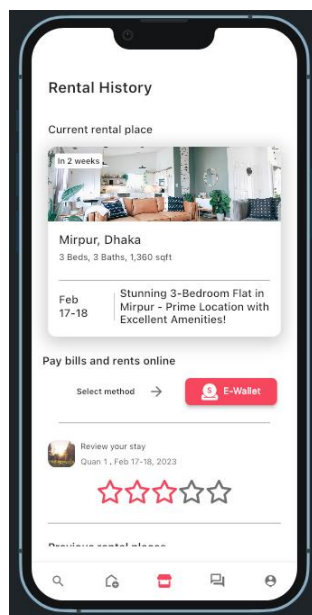


Figure 5.7.3.3: Rental history page

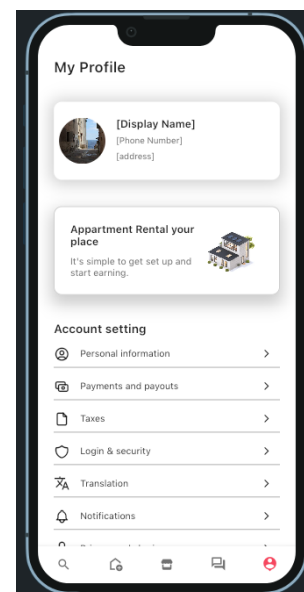


Figure 5.7.3.4: Profile page
