Abstract

Primary education is considered as the foundation of education. During this stage, students acquire basic skills, knowledge, and competencies in various subjects such as language, mathematics, science, etc. Being an international language, learning English at the primary education level is a great way to help children develop strong language skills that will benefit them in the future. It can provide them with a strong foundation in the language and open up opportunities for personal and professional growth in the future. Hence the objective of my project was to understand the opportunities and challenges to learn English language in primary education system in Bangladesh. I have completed my project in two parts. First, I have analyzed the English book contents from class one to five. Secondly, I have visited the school, observed their teaching method and took two classes. Finally, based on my work I have summarized the overall findings and recommended few suggestions.

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Introduction

As an international language, English is the most spoken language in the world, with over 1.5 billion people speaking it either as a first or second language. Learning English at the primary education level is a great way to help children develop strong language skills that will benefit them in the future. It can provide them with a strong foundation in the language and open up opportunities for personal and professional growth in the future.

The primary education system in Bangladesh is a five-years program that is compulsory and free for all children. The primary education system is a key component of the overall education system in Bangladesh and aims to provide basic education to children between the ages of 6 and 10. The primary education curriculum in Bangladesh is designed to provide students with a foundation in various subjects, including Bangla (the national language), English, mathematics, science, social science, religion, and physical education.

Learning English at the primary education level is crucial for children's personal and professional development and can have a lasting impact on their lives. Benefits of learning English language at early life also includes but not limited to— improving communication skills, cognitive development, access to a wider range of information, improving cultural understanding, etc. The government of Bangladesh has made significant efforts in recent years to improve the quality of primary education, including increasing the number of schools, training teachers, and providing educational materials. Despite these efforts, the primary education system in Bangladesh still faces several challenges, including a shortage of qualified teachers, inadequate facilities, and a lack of resources.

Objectives

Overall objective: To understand the opportunities and challenges to learn English language in primary education system in Bangladesh.

Specific objectives:

- 1. To assess the opportunities of English language learning.
- 2. To understand the teaching methods by observing the English class.
- 3. To identify the challenges of English language learning.

Methods

To achieve the objectives, I have followed the following steps:

- 1. I have selected Sreekola Govt. Primary School, which is located in Ullapara, Sirajganj, near to my home.
- 2. I have collected a certificate from my project supervisor at Daffodil International University, which I showed to the headmistress, expressed my purpose, and asked her permission.
- 3. After getting permission, I have planned my work schedule.
- 4. First, I have collected English textbooks of class/grade 1-5.
- 5. Then, I have summarized the key components that are related to 'Learning English' for the children for each grade.
- 6. As next step, I decided to observe the class and later on take the class.
- 7. I have observed three classes and took notes.
- 8. Then I have developed a lesson plan with the help of the respective teachers and I took classes.

Classroom observation report

First class observation

After getting permission from the school authority, I entered class One with the help of class teacher Md. Shah Alam sir. The class was about 50 minutes, from 9:00 am to 9:50 am. The students were first surprised and then the class teacher introduced me with them and talked about the purpose of my visit. Then I walked into the centre of the room and find a place to seat with the students. After that class teacher took the students attendance for around five minutes.

Topic of that class was 'English Alphabet'. For the class the teacher utilized a whiteboard and colorful marker pen. The teacher first draws one Alphabet and its associated picture. Then he first pronounced the Alphabet loudly several times so all students can hear and learn. After that he asked all students to pronounce the Alphabet together for several times. Following this technique class teacher Md. Shah Alam taught five Alphabets on that day. Main challenge I have observed in this class is inappropriate student teacher ratio. I really like his teaching method. After completing the class, the class teacher then concludes class by wishing the students well.

Second class observation

Next day, I choose class Three to observe the English class. I first met with the class teacher Mst Arifa Akter. The class was scheduled at noon, from 12:00pm to 12:50pm. During the scheduled class time, me with class teacher Arifa Akter madam entered the classroom. Like the previous day, students were first surprised and then the class teacher introduced me with them and talked about the purpose of my visit. Then I find a place to seat with the students from where I can see both teacher and students clearly. Before starting the lesson, class teacher took the students attendance for around five minutes.

Topic of that class was 'Count and write the numbers.' Class teacher Arifa Akter madam bought few cards with the pictures of animals and fruits, and few pencils. Next, she showed up few selected cards to the students, and asked students who can count it, come to the front, and write the number in the white board. Main challenge I have observed in this class is fear of English among the students. Overall, I really like this teaching method because students were fully engaged in the class, and they also enjoyed the class.

Third class observation

Early next week, I went to the school again. That day I choose class Five to observe. Like previous days at first I met with the class teacher, her name was Mst. Murshida Khatun, she was a nice person and very helpful and supportive. The class was scheduled in the morning from 10am to 10:50am. During the scheduled class time, me with class teacher Murshida mis entered the classroom. As I went to this school several times, many students already knew a bit about me, so they were not as surprised as previous class, but there were curious and excited to know more about me. Then the class teacher introduced me with them and stared class after completion of attendance of the students. Then I started my observation.

The scheduled lesson for that day was a story titled- 'Slow but steady wins the race'. Class teacher Murshida mis used multimedia system to deliver the lecture. The story was presented in front of the students as an animated video so students can properly understand the story and engage in the class. After finishing the video presentation, class teacher separately teaches the meaning of the difficult words with example. She also gave real life examples based on the lesson so students can take it as lifelong learning. After observing this class I have realized that teachers are not properly trained with the digital multimedia teaching system and also the modern teaching methods, this is a challenge that I have observed after this class.

Teaching experience

After observing three classes, to better understand the learning perspective of the students, I also conducted two class with the students to complete my project. Details of my teaching experience presented below:

Teaching experience# 1

Class: Four

Subject: English for Today

Topic: Traffic light

Duration: 50 Minutes

Summary:

As this was the first time for me to take a class in front of the students, I was feeling a little bit nervous. I have practiced several times in the previous night, so I can deliver my lesson properly. Next day morning I went to the school and the class teacher took me with her in the classroom and introduced me with the students and told the students that I will conduct today's class and instructed the students to cooperate with me. Then I introduced myself and keep talking as normal way so students can be comfortable with me. Once the student feels

normal then I completed the class attendance and start delivering the lesson. While I was taking the class, I was also looking at the students to understand whether they are listening to me or not. During the class I showed some video examples of traffic lights so students can better understand and compare with real life. After delivering the class lecture, I allowed students to further discuss this topic and ask me questions. After that I took a quick class test, I have written the questions in the white board and then I asked students to write their answers in their own notebook and once they are done, I instructed them to submit it to me. I quickly remark the answer scripts and declare the name of the student who scored highest. As I was running out of time, I began to wrap up the class by thanking the students for their patience and support. Overall, I enjoyed this class and it was a nice experience for me.

Summary:

As this was my second class, I was not much worried and nervous. I have prepared myself for the class in the previous night. Similar to my previous class, next day morning I went to the school and the class teacher took me with her in the classroom and introduced me with the students and told the students that I will conduct today's class and instructed the students to cooperate with me. Then I introduced myself and keep talking as normal way so students can be comfortable with me. Once the student feels normal then I completed the class attendance and start delivering the lesson. I have chosen present tense to teach the students. I have wrote the basic grammatical rules and examples in the whiteboard and explained in plain language. Later my presentation I have allowed students to ask questions and for an open discussion on this topic. Later, I have arranged a quick quiz session and declared a surprise gift who can answer many questions. This is how tried to engage my students during the class time. Finally, I gave thanks to my students to cooperate with me, and I believe they also enjoyed my class.

Overall findings

After observing and conducting the class, my overall comments about this school are:

- The teachers are friendly and supportive towards students.
- The Institution is well designed.
- This Institution has multimedia classroom.
- The natural environment of the school is excellent.
- There is a small playground.
- Students are encouraged to ask questions during their class.
- All teachers were supportive helpful to me.
- Students were well mannered.

Challenges of English language learning

- There is a lack of resources in the school, for example- audio-visuals, classroom settings, etc.
- Lack of trained teachers.
- Inappropriate teacher-student ratio.
- Fear of learning English among the students.
- Overall, there is a lack of English learning environment.

Recommendation

From my experience during this internship, I have some recommendations as follows:

- The school is located just beside the highway, so there is lot of noise comes from the vehicles, measures should be taken regarding this matter.
- This school need a larger playground, it is important to ensure facilities for extracurricular activities for the cognitive development of the students.
- The school authority can introduce more hands-on learning system for the students.
- Like some other primary schools, this schools can be painted with educational messages.

Conclusion

My experience with class observation and class conduction has been great. It was a new experience for me through which I was able to learn a lot of new things that how to teach students, and I also realized that teaching is really a noble profession. Which, of course, a lifelong learning experience for me. Apart from the teaching experience I have also learned the primary education system and academic curriculum. All these experiences motivated me to make some meaningful impact in the Bangladeshi primary education system from my individual level. Overall I enjoyed my work and it was not possible if my department did not create this opportunity for me. I want to give thanks to the Department of English at Daffodil International University. 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


