Class-1

The first class I went to was Class IV, which met from 10 to 10:45 a.m. on August 7, 2022. In this class, the teacher, Anik Miah, talked about the chapter "Friendship" from the students' textbooks. After saying hello and making sure everyone was there, he talked about what friendship is and why everyone needs it. Then he told two stories about people who are friends. He then gave some examples. He finally gave the students something to do when they got home. He told the students that their job was to write a paragraph about what friendship meant to them. Bengali was the language he spoke. A method he used is called "grammar translation" (GT). He talks out loud and can be understood. He knew how to get the children's focus in class and how to maintain it.

Class-2

On August 7, 2022, between 10:45 and 11:30 a.m., I observed a class V English lesson. The teacher's name was Nasrin Akter, and she taught "Sentence" as a language lesson after introducing herself to the class. She showed how to identify and group words. She then wrote how each kind of sentence was put together on the board and told the children to write it in their notebooks. She gave some more examples. At last, she found something for the students to do. She talked with individuals in different ways. She spoke in both L1 and L2. She was a lot of fun, though. And she found it easy to talk to the kids. She was also good at keeping time by being on time. She had a loud, clear voice and spoke English well. She talked well and knew a lot about what she was talking about. She knew how to get and keep the children's interest in class.

Even though the learning point wasn't hard, making a lesson plan for a month was something I'd never done before. I talked to them in the manner in which I made up with as well. But the next day, things went as planned and got better every day after that. I was so glad to be able to link them to the lessons I gave. I also gave them assignments to do. I noticed the next day that almost everyone had done their daily tasks.

Then I instructed the children to perform. The GTM and CLT methods were expertly blended together. The class had the students' attention, and they enjoyed themselves the entire time.

On the 6th of March, 2023, I had a class in Room 5 from 10 to 10:45 in the morning. Following the warm-up, I informed them that the next lesson will be on verbs and the fundamental guidelines for utilising them properly. After describing the verb, I continued by providing a few examples. I inquired about a variety of topics concerning verbs with them. In addition to that, I provided them with a few resources to assist them in expanding their knowledge of verbs. During the course of my class, I talked in both English and Bengali. They are very little to understand the English language properly. So, I used The "GT" method when I delivered my speech during class time.

Chapter-VII

Activities of the administration:

The Situation in the Exam Room

For the first time ever, I was tasked with keeping an eye on the testing area. I was cautioned to pay attention to the clock carefully during the exam. It was my responsibility, along with that of Nurul Hossein, to monitor the room during the English exam. 31 students were crammed into one room at the same time to take the exam. I've learnt how to monitor the clock, keep track of the students, and distribute tests and questions on time. I did my best to clarify the question to students who didn't get it. At the conclusion, the honourable sir complimented me on my performance. Honestly speaking I love that particular environment and enjoined the moments.

Chapter-VIII

Findings:

In point of fact, it was a pretty enjoyable experience. Everyone in authority, including the teachers, collaborated well and provided assistance when needed. Because of the way it was organised and furnished, the classroom did not provide a conducive environment for learning. Everyone in the class was paying very careful attention. I discovered that they were teaching themselves English by devoting a significant amount of time to studying grammar. The vast majority of the time, youngsters memorise their lessons without really understanding what it is that they are being taught. But if you want to know what I think of the things I've learnt in general, I'll tell you:

- I. In most English classes, the students communicate with one another using Bengali. It came to my attention that both teachers and students in the classroom were communicating in Bengali. The children have no idea of how important it is for them to learn English, nor do they understand the variety of ways in which English will be useful to them in the years to come.
- II. They were under a time pressure to complete the work. Lessons were only taken from textbooks by teachers so that they might finish up their courses as soon as possible.
- III. Even though the majority of teachers have college degrees, they had little experience. When I had some spare time, I asked teachers about their careers and how they got started in the field of education. They informed me that despite the fact that they held respectable degrees, they had never participated in Subject Based Training.
- IV. The results of the school are approximately an average, however the majority of the students have a limited understanding of the English language. With the assistance of Nurul Hasan, a teacher at my school, I went through the old result sheets from the previous years. I've seen that the average cumulative grade point average for the past five years is 4.50, however the majority of students struggle quite a bit with English.
- V. It is not hard for students to voice their opinions in front of the class. I went to two different classrooms and noticed that the students were free to ask any questions they wanted.

- VI. The ability of children to listen and converse effectively receives less attention from teachers. I looked over their lesson plan and course syllabus, but there was no mention of how they were going to improve their listening and speaking skills.
- VII. On the grounds of the school, there was not a single spot to eat. Everybody, even the teachers, brought their own food from home with them.
- VIII. The educational institution does not have a library. Students are required to spend a lot of time in the library. The institution has begun taking the necessary steps to establish a library.
- IX. Weak children don't take part in school events too often. I inquired with the instructor regarding the reasons why they do not assist those students in any way. However, the teachers acknowledged to me that although they had discussed the matter with the children's parents, the parents do not place a significant amount of importance on their academic performance.
- X. Every single one of the instructors is approachable and always ready to lend a hand. Due to the fact that this was my first time instructing, I experienced a lot of difficulties while on the job. However, every one of my instructors was helpful to me and kind to me.

Chapter-IX

Limitations:

- I. There wasn't enough room or space for students to maintain a positive environment. The seating arrangements were not ideal.
- II. The books ought to be memorized, page by page. I discovered that they had just memorized the material when I handed them homework. They are constantly in a rush to complete their assignments. As a result, I didn't typically advise them on the story's plot, subject, matter, or effects.
- III. No dining facilities could be seen on the school's property. Each student in the school brings a meal from home. It felt strange to me to eat lunch at home every day since I normally ate on campus while attending university.
- IV. They exclusively carry out the tasks listed in their government-established syllabus. They don't want to learn anything basic about other crucial stuff. They only care about performing well on their exams.

Chapter- X

Recommendations:

despite the fact that the school has been there for a good while and that all of the employees there do their best for the school's prosperity. I would want to contribute some ideas that will assist the school in becoming better.

- I. Make it mandatory for everyone in the classroom, including the instructors, to speak English. The most of the times I've gone to English classes, Bengali has been used as the language of communication. Students are unable to appreciate the significance of the English language as a result of this.
- II. Each student in the school ought to be provided with a copy of English Magazine. By reading English Magazine, the children will be exposed to new vocabulary.
- III. It would be beneficial for the school to establish an English Language Club in which students might participate in activities designed to help them improve their language skills. They will improve both their listening and speech skills as a result of this.
- IV. There ought to be a library packed with a sufficient number of books. It provides a comfortable setting for you to study in. It makes it easier for study groups to find a space to get together and discuss difficult subjects.

It was a one-of-a-kind experience for me, as well as a challenging work. The world that we live in now is one that is filled with a lot of pressure. If we want to succeed in this harsh environment, we need to make sure that we are properly prepared. 

Class observation: Class-1 The first class I went to was Class IV, which met from 10 to 10:45 a.m. on August 7, 2022. In this class, the teacher, Anik Miah, talked about the chapter "Friendship" from the students' textbooks. After saying hello and making sure everyone was there, he talked about what friendship is and why everyone needs it. Then he told two stories about people who are friends. He then gave some examples. He finally gave the students something to do when they got home. He told the students that their job was to write a paragraph about what friendship meant to them. Bengali was the language he spoke. A method he used is called "grammar translation" (GT). He talks out loud and can be understood. He knew how to get the children's focus in class and how to maintain it. Class-2 On August 7, 2022, between 10:45 and 11:30 a.m., I observed a class V English lesson. The teacher's name was Nasrin Akter, and she taught "Sentence" as a language lesson after introducing herself to the class. She showed how to identify and group words. She then wrote how each kind of sentence was put together on the board and told the children to write it in their notebooks. She gave some more examples. At last, she found something for the students to do. She talked with individuals in different ways. She spoke in both L1 and L2. She was a lot of fun, though. And she found it easy to talk to the kids. She was also good at keeping time by being on time. She had a loud, clear voice and spoke English well. Following the warm-up, I informed them that the next lesson will be on verbs and the fundamental guidelines for utilising them properly. After describing the verb, I continued by providing a few examples. I inquired about a variety of topics concerning verbs with them. In addition to that, I provided them with a few resources to assist them in expanding their knowledge of verbs. During the course of my class, I talked in both English and Bengali. They are very little to understand the English language properly. So, I used The "GT" method when I delivered my speech during class time. Chapter-VII Activities of the administration: The Situation in the Exam Room For the first time ever, I was tasked with keeping an eye on the testing area. I was cautioned to pay attention to the clock carefully during the exam. It was my responsibility, along with that of Nurul Hossein, to monitor the room during the English exam. 31 students were crammed into one room at the same time to take the exam. I've learnt how to monitor the clock, keep track of the students, and distribute tests and questions on time. I did my best to clarify the question to students who didn't get it. At the conclusion, the honourable sir complimented me on my performance. Honestly speaking I love that particular environment and enjoined the moments. Chapter-VIII Findings: In point of fact, it was a pretty enjoyable experience. Everyone in authority, including the teachers, collaborated well and provided assistance when needed. Because of the way it was organised

and furnished, the classroom did not provide a conducive environment for learning. Everyone in the class was paying very careful attention. I discovered that they were teaching themselves English by devoting a significant amount of time to studying grammar. The vast majority of the time, youngsters memorise their lessons without really understanding what it is that they are being taught. But if you want to know what I think of the things I've learnt in general, I'll tell you: I. In most English classes, the students communicate with one another using Bengali. It came to my attention that both teachers and students in the classroom were communicating in Bengali. The children have no idea of how important it is for them to learn English, nor do they understand the variety of ways in which English will be useful to them in the years to come. II. They were under a time pressure to complete the work. Lessons were only taken from textbooks by teachers so that they might finish up their courses as soon as possible. III. Even though the majority of teachers have college degrees, they had little experience. When I had some spare time, I asked teachers about their careers and how they got started in the field of education. They informed me that despite the fact that they held respectable degrees, they had never participated in Subject Based Training. IV. The results of the school are approximately an average, however the majority of the students have a limited understanding of the English language. With the assistance of Nurul Hasan, a teacher at my school, I went through the old result sheets from the previous years. I've seen that the average cumulative grade point average for the past five years is 4.50, however the majority of students struggle quite a bit with English. V. It is not hard for students to voice their opinions in front of the class. I went to two different classrooms and noticed that the students were free to ask any questions they wanted. VI. The ability of children to listen and converse effectively receives less attention from teachers. I looked over their lesson plan and course syllabus, but there was no mention of how they were going to improve their listening and speaking skills. VII. On the grounds of the school, there was not a single spot to eat. Everybody, even the teachers, brought their own food from home with them. VIII. The educational institution does not have a library. Students are required to spend a lot of time in the library. The institution has begun taking the necessary steps to establish a library. IX. Weak children don't take part in school events too often. I inquired with the instructor regarding the reasons why they do not assist those students in any way. However, the teachers acknowledged to me that although they had discussed the matter with the children's parents, the parents do not place a significant amount of importance on their academic performance. X. Every single one of the instructors is approachable and always ready to lend a hand. Due to the fact that this was my first time instructing, I experienced a lot of difficulties while on the job. However, every one of my instructors was helpful to me and kind to me. Limitations: I. There wasn't enough room or space for students to maintain a positive environment. The seating arrangements were not ideal. II. The books ought to be memorized, page by page. I discovered that they had just memorized the material when I handed them homework. They are constantly in a rush to complete their assignments. As a result, I didn't typically advise them on the story's plot, subject, matter, or effects. III. No dining facilities could be seen on the school's property. Each student in the school brings a meal from home. It felt strange to me to eat lunch at home every day since I normally ate on campus while attending university. IV. They exclusively carry out the tasks listed in their government-established syllabus. They don't want to learn anything basic about other crucial stuff. They only care about performing well on their exams. Recommendations: despite the fact that the school has been there for a good while and that all of the employees there do their best for the school's prosperity. I would want to contribute some ideas that will assist the school in becoming better. I. Make it mandatory for everyone in the classroom, including the instructors, to speak English. The most of the times I've gone to English classes, Bengali has been used as the language of communication. Students are unable to appreciate the significance of the English language as a result of this. II. Each student in the school ought to be provided with a copy of English Magazine. By reading English Magazine, the children will be exposed to new vocabulary. III. It would be beneficial for the school to establish an English Language Club in which students might participate in activities designed to help them improve their language skills. They will improve both their listening and speech skills as a result of this. IV. There ought to be a library packed with a sufficient number of books. It provides a comfortable setting for you to study in. It makes it easier for study groups to find a space to get together and discuss difficult subjects. Conclusion: It was a one-of-a-kind experience for me, as well as a challenging work. The world that we live in now is one that is filled with a lot of pressure. If we want to succeed in this harsh environment, we need to make sure that we are properly prepared. The instruction of the English language in our country is now not at a high level, but it is noticeably more advanced than it was in the past. In this particular area, there are some aspects that could be improved. When I finally finish my education, one of my goals is to work in education. This was a wonderful opportunity for me to gain knowledge about the state of the English Language Teaching profession at the present time. I believe that, in the long run, these things will be beneficial to me.
