

3.9: Self-assessment



4.3: History

A country's foundation is its education system. It is the cornerstone of a nation's development in all its forms. A 1998 initiative to start a school was sparked by this knowledge, and in 2012 the school expanded to become a college. The previous name of the school was Khilgaon High School,- the current name is Khilgaon School and College.

4.4: School Management System

MPO-affiliated government school. The governing authority is with the school. The parents and teachers of the pupils cast their ballots to choose the Chairman of this controlling body. An entrance exam and an admissions circular are distributed annually for school admission. The principal oversees all of the school's internal operations.

4.5: Curriculum for Education

The government curriculum is used in schools. In addition, every school has a unique curriculum. Students receive a syllabus book at the start of the school year, where each chapter in the entire book is broken down into multiple areas for analysis. Apart from the government-provided board book, the school recommends several publications to augment the pupils' knowledge base.

Internship Activity

5.1: Class Observation

Class: 1

Observed 1st class in class 9 on January 11, 2024. This is taught at Khilgaon School and College by Jakir Sir, an English teacher. He was enrolled in a class that ran from 10:50 to 11:30 in the second period. The pupils welcomed us with open arms as soon as we walked into the classroom. That was excellent. He went on to introduce me as their visiting instructor. He enrolled in the narration course. Subsequently, he presented the subject and went into great detail about it. He gave some illustrations to help with comprehension. He gave some guidelines for keeping the structures in mind. He asked the pupils if they understood the material and if they had any questions after finishing his presentation. Next, he asked each student to provide an example on their own. and provided some homework for the following lesson. It greatly aided the pupils' comprehension.

Class: 2

I observed the second lesson of class 10, which is taught by MD. Ahsan on February 18 from 10 a.m. to 10:45 a.m. At Khilgaon School and College, Ahsan Hossain teaches English as well. Thirty of the forty pupils enrolled in this class were present on that particular day. Dr. Ahsan took the class. He spoke with the students and gave an overview of the subject before launching into his presentation. Class 10 pupils paid close attention because they were older than the other kids. Then, trying to keep in mind that tense and Right form of verb form are closely related, he attempted to remind the students about tense. Without solid information, it is impossible to use the correct form of the verb. After that, he provided some guidelines and used resources to discuss the subject. He took advantage of the Advanced English Learning Book.

Class: 3

On February 24, I attended the third class of class 11. It was also the fifth period. They were the freshers. The teacher for this class was Principal Sir Howlader. There were sixty students in this class and eighty-five total. They could not stop smiling. He first read the passage aloud to the students before translating it into Bengali. Subsequently, he had to identify the unknown word and explain its meaning. He also inquired about word translation and meaning from the students. Despite their inexperience, they performed well in the classroom. Because they appreciated reading the chapter, they had a great time in class.



My first lesson was taught on January 30, 2024. I was taken by the headmaster personally. They were Class 9. To teach students how to write paragraphs, I used the text about the tree plantation. I believe that teaching paragraph writing requires extensive use of brainstorming. I thus asked the students to write down, in brief, what they think of when they hear the word "tree plantation." Students responded on their initiative.

They responded quite well. I asked each kid individually to write one keyword on the whiteboard. I then instructed them to use that keyword in a sentence. At least five to seven lines were written by each student on the keywords. This indicates a problem—not all students were able to construct sentences correctly. The kids had to repeatedly ask me questions on how to translate a Bengali sentence into an English sentence. They find it difficult to translate sentences from Bengali into English, even though they can put one together rather effectively.



I had taught my second class in class 10 on February 8, 2024. Just as in my earlier classes, I created a lesson plan. I began by introducing myself before introducing the subject. Here, I utilized the book "English for Today" as our lesson material.

I gave the kids a task to identify the unknown words and attempt to explain their meanings before we read the poem. I had to explain the meaning of the New Vocabulary to the students because they were unable to understand it. After that, there was a question-and-answer work in pairs. I then instructed the students to work in pairs to find the answers to these questions. Students were engaged in it with considerable curiosity. Students inquired unexpectedly as to why I was teaching them. even though I was ready to respond to the questions already. They asked me why I was there. I said that attending their classes is a requirement for my academic program. With a focus on group projects, this new curriculum aims to help students strengthen their communication abilities.



- 5. The internship improved my professional growth as an aspiring English language instructor.
- 6. The importance of spending the entire internship observing seasoned educators.
- 7. The importance of the internship in helping me to fulfill my professional goal of teaching English to second language learners.
