Class Observations

Class Observation (1): It was class viii, Morning shift. Class started at 9.00am.

So I reached their 15 minutes earlier. Then I met Birsity Akter madam in the teacher's common room. After receiving my permission letter, she allowed me to observe the class. At just 9.00 am she and I entered into the class.

After taking attendance, Bristy Akter continued the class. The topic was 'Article' and she wrote it on the black board. Bristy Akter started with the definition of Article. Then shewent for the

classifications. She took the class in a structural way, it is familiar as TheGrammar Translation Method. That was a teacher centered classroom in most of the time. She look for the vowel sounds which are an important part of Article rules. I observed that, she only teachesthe main rules which are relevant to exam. The class ended at 09.45 am.

Class Observation (2): My second class observation was in class vii. Like the former observation, first I took permission from the course teacher Md. Moftofa. The teacher asked me about my purpose and ambition. When he came to know that teaching is my ambition, he gave advice to me to have a strict look on his strategy and techniques. The class started at 10.00 am.

He started with the background of the poet. Then he went for Poetry recitation. After recitation, he explained it. The class ended at 10.35am. I found the strategy simple and interesting.

Class Observation (3): My third class observation was in class viii. I took permission from the course teacher Md. Nuruddin. The teacher asked me about my University and my background. The class started at 12.00pm.
