Abstract

This report describes the internship that I had done at Banophool Adibashi Green Heart College. Banophool Adibashi Green Heart College is one of the leading schools in Dhaka. I made this report based on my experiences of observing and conducting some English language classes over there. On that school I observed how teachers take classes, how they control classes and how students behave with their teachers. Then I planned for some activities which were based on my practical experiences regarding my class observations. I included the details of my own experience of teaching. After finishing the entire project I learned how to teach and how high school teachers are teaching. The project will definitely be very much helpful for me in future.

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Introduction

Teaching at School or College has been my aim/passion since my childhood. In my Internship Project, I visited Banophool Adibashi Green Heart College in Mirpur-13 during October 29-31, 2018. This internship is a part of the four years B.A program which has been assigned by my English Department. This internship project helped me a lot to find out the present day scenario of English language teaching in Bangladesh. From this internship I could come across the real scenario of school teaching in our country. I also learned how the teachers conduct classes and how teachers teach students.

Objectives

The objectives of this project are as follows:

- 1. To know about the present day scenario of English language teaching in Bangladesh.
- 2. To learn about various teaching methods of English language teaching at school level.
- 3. To observe classes and the teaching methods/aids used in the classroom.
- 4. To plan and teach lessons for specific activities.
- 5. To demonstrate an understanding of student behavior in the physical education setting.
- 6. To find out the impacts of my teaching and assess their performances.

Methodology

At first I chose and visited the school, Banophool Adibashi Green Heart College in Mirpur-13. And I talked to the school authority about my internship project. Then finally I was able to manage the school authority to allow me to do the internship over there.

In Banophool Adibashi Green Heart College, I observed class 7 and class 9 because on that time other class students were busy with their examinations. I observed 2 classes and learned many techniques. Before taking classes I prepared two lessons plans with the help of class teachers and finally took the classes. In this work, a co-ordinator named Ms. Motia khan helped me a lot.

Class Observations Report

First class observation:

The classroom was generally clean and tidy, had good natural light and basic teaching equipment like blackboard and chalk. There was sufficient furniture for the students in the classes. It was class 7, day shift and 12 students were present. The class started at 1.25 PM and the class teacher Joshep Chakma Sir entered in to the classroom at 1.28 PM. Then I took permission for observing the class from the teacher and he gave me permission.

After taking the attendance Joshep Sir started his class. In the class, the subject was 'English for Today' and the lesson was 'Green House Effects'. I saw that both teacher and students had proper communication in the classroom. Sometimes Sir wrote examples on the board for clarifying points.

The class teacher followed some techniques and methods during his class. The class was interactive and the teacher was friendly towards the students creating a comfortable learning environment.

Second class observation:

The second class started at 3.00 PM and it was class 9, day shift. The class teacher's name was Milton Chakma. Sir reached the classroom on time. At first he took the attendance. Then he started to take his class and I observed this class carefully. In the class he talked about Narration and its use. He talked to students in both Bangla and English.

After finishing going through the rules, the teacher gave them the task to write and practice. Then the students tried to complete their task and submitted their answer scripts to the class teacher upon which Sir provided some feedback. The teacher followed many techniques and methods in the classroom. Before finishing the class he gave some homework on the topic and students took note on their dairies.

Teaching Experience

First Class of Teaching:

I was incredibly nervous on my first day of teaching. Before taking the class, I made a lesson plan on what I would teach my students in the classroom the next day. In my first class of teaching, I taught the students use of Article. It was class 7.

At first I introduced the topic and provided many examples. During my teaching, I tried to follow the communicative way of teaching. I tried to be interactive as much as possible. Sometime I shared my real life experience with students so that they could enjoy the class. Last 15 minutes, I gave them a writing task and they finished their work easily on time.

The class teacher was extremely supportive towards me. It was a great experience for me.

Second class of teaching:

For the second class I made a lesson plan the same way I did for the earlier class. It was class 9 and the topic was use of Tenses.

At first I introduced myself and ask them about their favorite past times. Then I started my teaching season. I taught them tense. I went through the grammatical rules and tried to explain them with examples. All the students listened very carefully and they asked me questions on confusions. I taught to define present, past, future and their structures. In the class I shared my real life experience as a student and taught them interactively.

It was another great experience for me. The class teacher always supported me and appreciated my teaching quality as well.

Overall Findings

The academic system as well as the campus environment provides a strong support for quality education over there. During the time of class observation and teaching I found both negative and positive things. The students are well-mannered and active learners who participate in class works and home works.

When I observed the class, the teachers were very friendly with the students. And the negative thing was the seating arrangement which was not appropriate for a language class. I observed that the students couldn't write properly due to enough space.

The students tried to use English in the classroom to enhance their listening and speaking. The teacher had fluency in speaking both Bangla and English. When I have taken the classes, I found that the students were very eager to learn.

Recommendations

- a) In the classroom, the use of technology such as sound system, multimedia can enhance the teaching learning scenario and can make the lessons interesting.
- b) Google classroom for teaching language can be effective and engaging.
- c) Teachers can use mix methods in the classroom for teaching and learning English and grammar.

Conclusion

During the internship, I had a great experience. When I visited the school, I got a new and different environment and people. At first I felt very nervous, gradually I adopted the environment. I want to give thanks to the people who supported me throughout my internship. I want to give thanks to my supervisor Ms. Afroza Akhter Tina who guided me for writing the internship report finally.
