Abstract

The main purpose of this internship was to find out "The present Scenario of English Language Teaching in a Bangladeshi School/ College." Chapter V

Class Observation Report

With a view to completing my internship report, I had to observe at least three classes. These are xii (Science), xii (Commerce) and xii (Arts) in "Shaheed Police Smrity College".

Class Observation -01:

Mr. Mazidul Haque who taught English Second paper to class xii(Science). Since it was my first observation of class, Mr. Mazidul Haque introduced me to the students first. He delivered his lecture on "Modifiers". At first he wrote the tittle of the topic on the board. Then he asked the students about this topic. Some students replied but rest of the students could not reply properly. After that he discussed about pre-modifiers and post-modifiers. After delivering his effective lecture, he gave some homework on this topic.

Class Observation-02:

Md. Masud Rana took English Second Paper with class-xii (commerce) on "Preposition". After entering into the class room, he told them to show their course plan. Then he wrote the title of the topic on the board. Then he taught about the use of preposition with examples. Some students asked some questions and he replied cleverly. After finishing his class, he gave homework.

Class Observation-03:

Mr. Rezaul Haque was taking an English 2st paper class. He delivered his lecture on 'Narration/ Speech'. First he wrote the topic on the white board. Then he discussed details about Narration. After his lecture, he asked some questions and gave same examples for students. Some students could write after that he taught them how to transfer from direct to indirect Speech/Narration. At the end of the class he gave some home tasks for students.

For my internship program took three classes. Here is my teaching experience:

Most of the students answered properly. However, it was very interesting class because the students were happy and they enjoyed the class.

My teaching experience was very good because I had a lot of interactions not only with me but also among the students.
