Abstract

This report is based on the experience that I gathered during my internship project conducting an online class focusing on self-evaluation of my teaching. For that purpose I used Google Meet to complete my project. I had high expectations for bringing out the best from the students and always tried to motivate the students to speak. There was a mixture of different performing levels of students. I tried to establish a good teacher-student relationship. I always tried to maintain professionalism and a good relationship with colleagues. I used the Communicative Language Teaching (CLT) method for teaching. I always tried to make progress by using different methods depending on the context. I prepared myself in several ways depending on the elements: teaching materials, teaching style, class observation, assessment and feedback. Though it was an online class, the purpose of this report is to know how teachers organize instructions, how teachers manage students in the classroom, which materials are used in language teaching by the teachers, how they interact with students, and also to know how to enhance their language teaching. This paper includes various problems and obstacles that I had during my internship and how I overcame those ensuring a good and safe learning environment. This report concludes with some recommendations based on the findings and the checklists from the observation to make the learning process more effective.

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Chapter I

Introduction

The project paper interns used to conduct and observe classes at schools before this pandemic situation had occurred. According to the declaration of the Bangladesh Government and Ministry of Education all the educational institutions have been shut down from 16th March 2020 to reduce the spread of Corona Virus. Because of this situation, all our academic activities have transferred from physical to online platforms.

Our project paper task titled "Report on Online Class Observation and Conduction in English during the Outbreak of COVID-19" has also been shifted to an online platform. Due to that reason all interns had to teach and observe classes online. Our supervisor Ms. Tahsina Yasmin scheduled our classes. She instructed us with every detail of this project. She took our classes online. I was instructed to take a class of the Romantic Poetry (ENG 224) course of the students of 14th batch of Ashulia Campus. As I was free to observe any two of my peers' classes, I observed Farzana Sharmin Swarna's and Afra Anam's classes. When I took class my peers observed my class and when they took classes I observed them. In this way I experienced how to take tertiary level classes using Google Meet. It was a great opportunity for me to utilize my learning and experience to take a university class.

Chapter II

Objectives

The fundamental objectives of the proposed internship are to identify the present scenario of language learning and teaching through online classes during the outbreak of COVID-19. The objectives are given below:

Chapter III

Methodology

The report is a summary of the research about the online class situation in this pandemic COVID-19 situation. The authority of our university decided to give us the opportunity of taking class through an online platform. The paper includes class observation, method investigation, taking class and analyzing the performance of students.

Choosing the host institution

I could not visit any school because of COVID-19. So the authority of my university decided to give us an alternative opportunity. We were given the opportunity to take class online. Therefore, I completed my internship from my own university. The name of my institution is Daffodil International University. The branch is located in Sector 6 at Uttara, Dhaka.

Having a facilitator

The facilitator of my internship is my supervisor Ms. Tahsina Yasmin. She helped me and guided me by giving instruction through online meetings, messages and mails. These helped me a lot to complete this project.

Selecting classes

The authority of DIU allowed us to conduct and observe classes from the courses that my supervisor was teaching. I was allowed to take a class of the course named Romantic Poetry (ENG 224). I took a class on the poem "Tintern Abbey" written by William Wordsworth which was selected by my supervisor.

Classroom observation

I observed two of my peer's classes. One was on Romantic Poetry and another was on Classics in Translation. They started their classes on time. I used the checklist to observe their classes properly.

Interviewing the teacher

I asked my course teacher to know about her strategies. She helped me a lot by sharing her method of teaching. She also shared her video lesson with me prior to the conduction of my class. I observed her classes very attentively and tried to use her method too which helped me immensely to conduct my class successfully.

Self-assessment

I took the class according to my lesson plan. I tested the students by asking questions and they answered them. I arranged some tasks and games for the students. Everyone was very enthusiastic and responded properly. I also tried to create a friendly environment in my class. I tried my best to make the online class lively by letting them read. At last I took class feedback from them.

Chapter V

Class Observation Report

I observed two classes which were conducted by one of my classmates named Farzana Sharmin Swarna (171-10-431) and another one by my senior named Afra Anam (152-10-344) respectively. They both were fabulous in their own way of teaching.

Class Observation Report One

I observed the class of Classics in Translation (ENG 431) on 15th June 2020 which was conducted by Afra Anam. She started her class at 10.00 am and finished at 10.55 am. She began her class timely and finished within time too. It was an online class that was held on Google Meet because of the pandemic situation of COVID-19. 12 students attended the class out of 38 students as it was set outside the scheduled class. She discussed the story of Book 14 of *The Iliad*.

She started her class with an ice breaking session. She showed some of the characters' pictures from the book to catch students' attention. Students were very attentive and they responded very well. She explained the lines from the text. She used pictures along with the text to make the students understand. She showed them by sharing her screen. She focused on her lecture throughout the whole class properly to achieve her objectives fully. She asked if they had any questions or confusions. She used Bangla language to make the topic easier to perceive. She prepared a one word question-answer session after giving all information on the given topic. Then she took feedback by asking interactive questions to the students. Most of them tried to give answers by speaking and using the in-built Google Meet comment box too.

She maintained her class properly from the beginning of the class to the end. She was friendly and interactive with the students. She had a clear voice throughout the class. She successfully conducted the class.

Class Observation Report Two

I observed a class of Romantic Poetry (ENG 224) course on 17th June 2020 which was conducted by my classmate Farzana Sharmin Swarna. She took classes of 1.3, 2.1 and 2.2 batches from Uttara Campus on the poem 'Tintern Abbey' by William Wordsworth. She started her class at 11.30 am and finished her class at 12.15 pm. It was an online class which was held on Google Meet. 23 students attended the class out of 30. She started her class with an introduction session. At first she gave an introduction to the poet William Wordsworth. Then she discussed the long title and its meaning. She arranged slides to make the students understand in a better way. She showed pictures of some new words. At first she showed the first section of the poem with pictures and then she explained them line by line. She also asked the word meaning of some words and students responded to her too. She used Bangla language for better understanding. Though she sounded a little nervous to me, she overcame that soon. The best thing about her class conduction was that she used the online platform significantly and fully. After giving a lecture on the topic, she took a small quiz on Google Form. Students attended the quiz. Before closing the class she took feedback about the class from the students using a Google Form which was quite impressive.

From the beginning to the end of the class, she had a clear voice and could hold the attention of the students. She successfully achieved her objectives of the lesson and conducted the class in a very friendly and positive manner.

Chapter VI

Teaching Experience

To conduct the class assigned to me I took preparation to give my level best. For that I went through some steps such as: making a lesson plan, selecting activities, arranging games and organizing my thoughts to deal with the students.

On 21st June 2020 I conducted a class of the same course Romantic Poetry (ENG 224) for the students of the 14th batch of Permanent Campus, Ashulia. I took the class on the first section of "Tintern Abbey" written by William Wordsworth. I started the class at 2.30 pm and finished the class at 3.30 pm. 28 students out of 30 were present on that day. I made a power point slide and used Google Form. I arranged a game to warm up the students. At first I showed them pictures and they had to guess a new word after matching the paired words. They answered them all. I also kept two pictures at the end so that they could guess the name of the poem. They guessed the answer properly. Then I showed them the picture of the poet and gave a brief introduction to the poet William Wordsworth. I also briefly discussed the romantic era, romantic literature and its characteristics.

I showed them the long title and explained every word of the title. I also talked about the significance of the title. I discussed literary devices such as: setting, form, category, meter and narrator. Then I made them speak the lines of the poem at first and later I explained word by word showing them pictures. I used many pictures with the text to make them understand every line of the poem properly. I also shared my own experience about going on a tour. I tried to make them perceive the knowledge of the poem and romantic era. So I tried my best to use the given time properly and arranged my lesson plan accordingly.

I made them speak throughout the class and they were also very attentive to respond. They responded on microphone and by texting in the comment box. After the discussion part, I took a small quiz on the topic in Google Form. They gave the quiz though some of them could not because of poor net connection. Before finishing the class, I gave them another Google Form to take class feedback. They responded very well.

I checked out the observation reports that were done by my fellow observers Wakil ur Rahim and Farzana Sharmin Swarna. They were present in my class and observed my teaching. Both mentioned that I should practice pronunciation skills more. I agree with them as I can acknowledge my weakness. I will try to be more careful while pronouncing and will practice to improve. I appreciate their recommendation. Another thing Swarna said that I should be more focused on the feedback of students. From my perception I tried my best to focus on that part and tried to get feedback from the students asking about their confusion several times and making them answer my questions. Still I appreciate her recommendation. I will try to be more focused on this part. Another fellow observer Wakil ur Rahim said that my voice was not clear but my other observer said my voice was loud and clear. I also think that my voice was clear enough to clarify the lesson. I tried to encourage both boys and girls to speak in my class. I appreciate their valuable recommendations. I will try to be a more effective and good speaker in future In Sha Allah. Their good comments encouraged me and inspired me a lot. I am very grateful to them for becoming my class observers. Their recommendation and good comments will improve me to become a good presenter, a good speaker and overall a good teacher too.

I am a home tutor. I have been teaching students for some years. But I did not think that I would be able to take class on an online platform in such a graceful way as physical class and online class are totally different. Moreover, I conducted a class of university students which was unimaginable. I am very grateful to my faculty teachers who taught us so many things such as: how to use Google Form, Google Slides, Docs, Google Meet, presentation. I have learnt how to be well-organized, patient, punctual and overall how to be an effective teacher from my teachers. Because of them I could utilize my knowledge and learning successfully even in this pandemic situation. I have experienced a new teaching way due to my respected teachers and because of the opportunity given by my University. So I am very satisfied.

Chapter VII

Overall Findings

Class Observation Findings

From the experience of class observations I got some important features of English language teaching to make my class educative, enjoyable and resourceful.

Lesson Formation

A lesson plan is an important element of teaching. It can help a teacher to conduct classes properly. My peers made lesson plans before taking classes. They said that lesson plans helped them to conduct their classes in an organized way.

Lesson Delivery

All of my peers started their classes in a welcoming manner. They used both English and Bangla languages to make the students understand their lessons properly. They arranged questions, games and feedback sessions. They discussed the topic clearly. Above all, it was rewarding to observe their classes.

Lesson Conduction

As all the classes were taken through online, the materials were technological. The lessons were delivered by teachers through Google Meet, PowerPoint, Google Docs & Forms, images and so on.

Class Time Management

My peers were concerned about time management except one. Though she held her class properly but she could not complete teaching the class utilizing the allotted time of one hour. It is very important to manage the time while teaching. Otherwise, it puts a negative impact on the class.

Involvement of Students

Students were involved in the classes. They were very responsive and active in the classes.

Advantages of Online Class

Because of the blessings of technology, the classes were taken even in this outbreak of COVID-19. Everybody could attend the class staying safely at home. Teachers could organize their lessons rightly. Both teachers and students got the opportunity to explore technology in an effective way. There was no chance to miss the lessons as online classes were recorded and students could see them later too.

Disadvantages of Online Class

Internet connection was one of the biggest interruptions in online classes. Because of poor internet connection, some students had to suffer. Some of them could not attend the class and do the tasks even if they wanted. As it was not a physical class, the interaction between teachers and students was not absolute.

Teaching Experience Findings

Lesson Preparation

I prepared myself in the best way I could do to conduct my class successfully. At first I read my topic and wrote in a diary which helped me a lot to make my lesson plan and to conduct the class organized. I divided the entire time for different tasks. I arranged the game, quiz and feedback sections. Listening, speaking, writing and reading skills were in my consideration. I tried my best to make the class enjoyable and informative. I maintained a friendly tone with the students and made sure to involve them in the class.

Lesson Delivery

I delivered the lessons as per my lesson plan. I divided my plan into different sections. At first I introduced myself with them. I made them play a game which was about joining words and making a new word. Then I tried to make them read and speak throughout the entire class so that they did not feel bored. I made them write too in the comment box and took a small quiz. I followed the CLT method for teaching.

Student's Involvement

Students were very attentive and active throughout the class. They were quite enthusiastic. They participated in every task given to them.

Feedback Summary

I arranged a feedback form to get to know about students' opinions. Through the form, I got to know if they liked my way of teaching and understood the lesson or not. I was very pleased to receive positive responses from them.

Chapter VIII

Recommendations

This internship gave me abundant experiences about teaching. I would like to make some recommendations for improvement based on my experiences.

- The students should be given more creative activities.
- Some pair work or group work should be given.
- As students face internet problems, they should be given enough time to complete their activities.
- Proper facilities should be ensured to attend the online classes from start to finish so that they can do the class without facing any inconvenience.

Chapter IX

Conclusion

I have completed this work as part of my final semester project. It has been a fantastic experience for me. I was very excited and honored to play the role of a teacher. I had an opportunity to get the idea of taking class through online. As it is the era of technology, it is surely going to help me a lot in future. 
3.1 Screenshot of warm up game





