Abstract

2nd Class: A PPT file of several reading texts with practical example has been used.

Class Observation 1

The intern teacher first greeted the students and shared some basic ideas about the topic. She started the class by explaining rules with the appropriate example for better learning. After finishing a rule and providing examples intern teacher asked the students whether they have understood or not and then he gave some practice tasks to the students and students were asked to submit their feedback in the chat bar of Google Meet. If the students made errors in their tasks the teacher makes them correct through providing feedback. Though it is difficult to connect all students in the online classroom, but the intern teacher was trying to keep them concentrated in the class. In the whole class, the intern teacher showed his enthusiasm and impartial quality. Throughout the class, both the teacher and students were facing internet issues several times.

Strength of the intern Teacher

- i. The intern teacher was punctual in maintaining the class schedule.
- ii. The intern teacher has good command over the topic and lesson.
- iii. The intern teacher has good communication skills.
- iv. The intern teacher is very cordial with the students.

Class Observation 2

The intern teacher first welcomed the students and was trying to ensure all students` attendance and then tried to share his computer screen to the students. After sharing the screen the teacher started to explain basic information about the topic and talking about the advantages of learning the topic. The intern teacher read out a text and translates it into L1 for a better understanding of the students. After finishing the text the intern teacher provided some symbol questions to the students to understand the students` understanding. Often the intern teacher asked students particular questions to answer then some active students provided answers from their understanding. If the students made errors in their answers, the teacher

would make them correct. The intern teacher tried to engage all the students in the class but he was failed due to the online class. The Grammar-Translation method was used in the class. Google meet was used as the medium of conducting class and several times both the students and the teachers faced internet trouble. He was enthusiastic in answering the questions and encouraged students.

Some of the students gave feedback rapidly and some couldn't due to the poor internet connection. Students made errors while replying and the instructor corrected them. At the end of the class, students were asked to ask for any queries but they did not. During class time, students seemed very much communicative. Throughout the class both the teacher and students faced the internet connection problem.

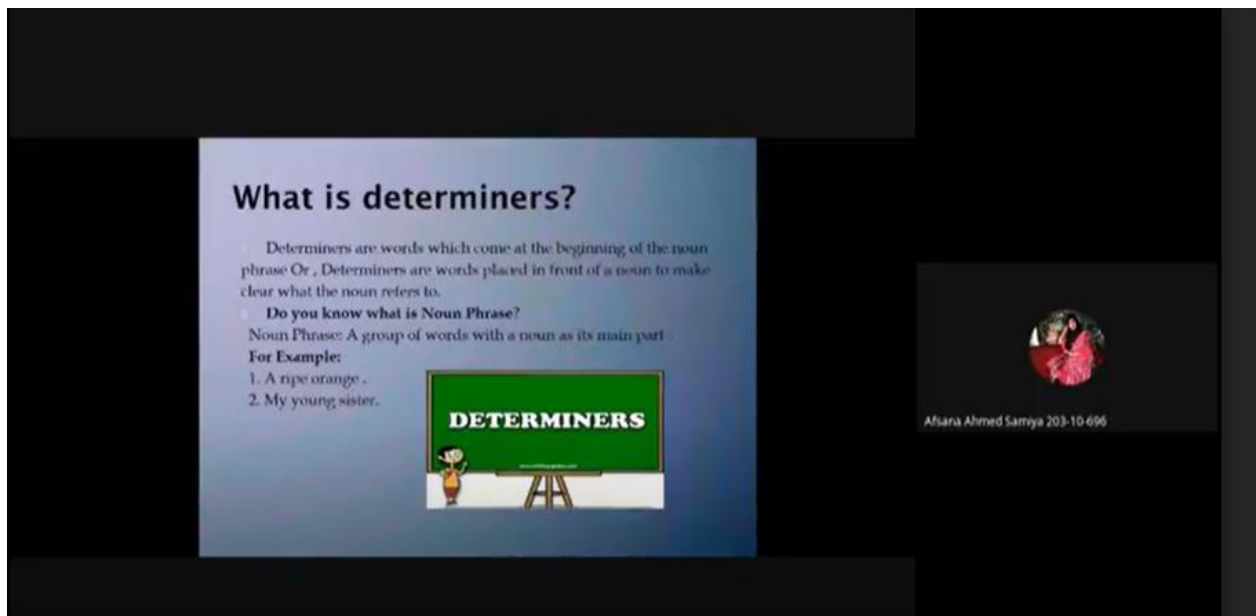


Figure 01: Observation of Class No. 01

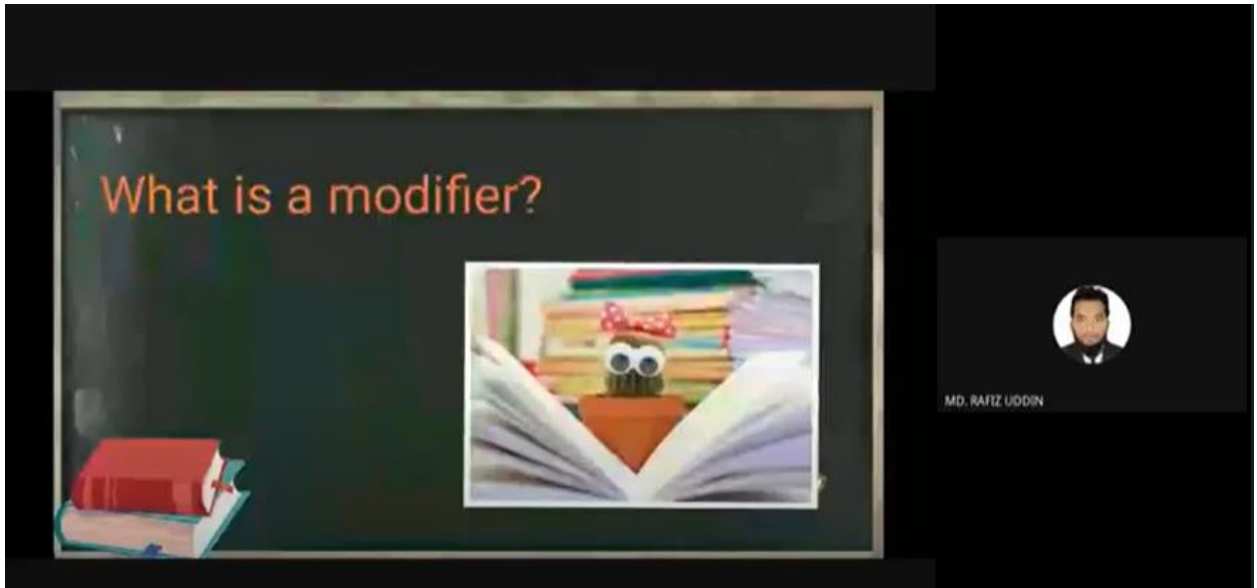


Figure 02: Observation of Class No. 02

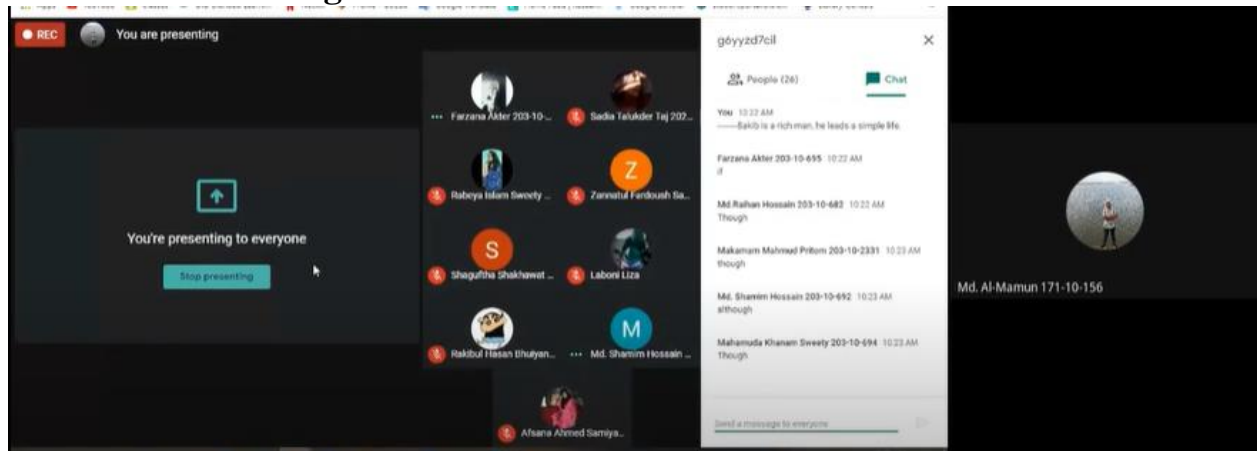


Figure 3: Teaching Class

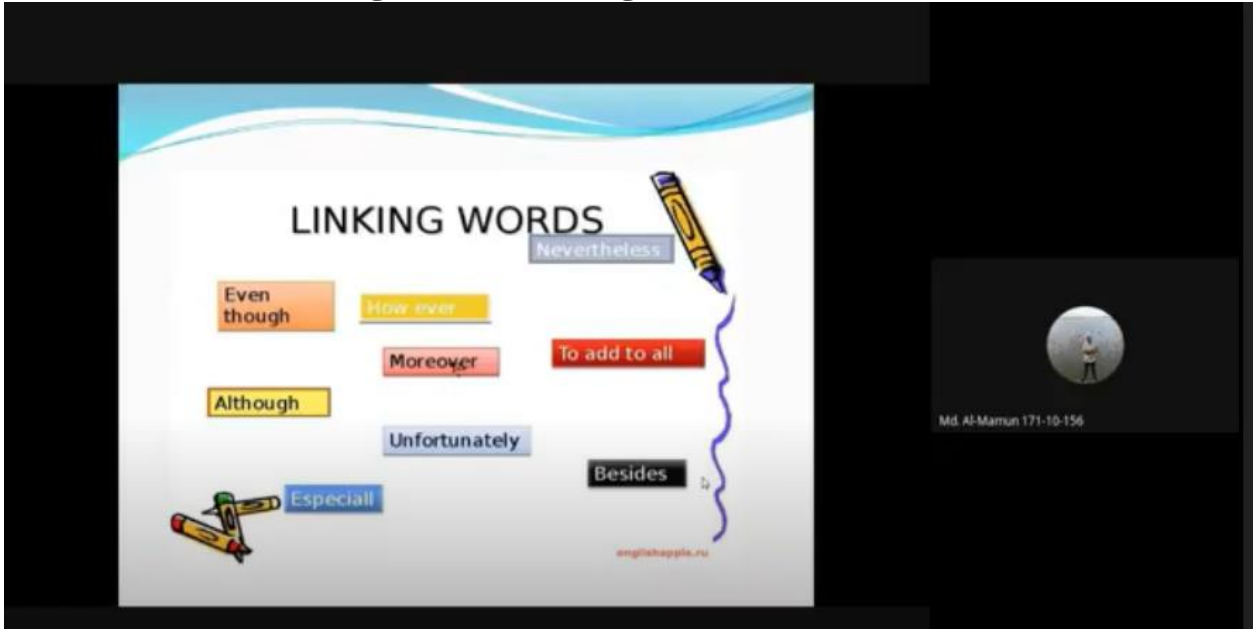


Figure 4: Teaching Class
