Abstract

This report will give an overview of my experience of the current situation of English language teaching in a Bangladeshi English medium school. I chose NextGen International Coding and Engineering (NICE) School and College for completing my internship. There is an overview on teaching techniques such as lesson plan, teaching style, assessment, learning style, class observation, feedback and evaluation. This report also purposes bringing out the methods the teachers use in the classes besides teaching techniques. This report will also give some modifications and recommended by the intern in order to enhance English language teaching at school level. To conclude, this study provides some recommendations based on the overall findings of the intern which can help in figuring out strengths, weaknesses, performance, academic curriculum, opportunities, facilities of the observed teachers, and the institution.

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CHAPTER 1

[Introduction]

1.1: Introduction

English is an international language. English plays a vital role in our education sector. In Bangladesh, we learn English as our second language. Many people around us learn English from their childhood but do not know the proper use of English language. They do not have the proficiency in English language. Most of the schools are trying to help their students with different kind of academic activities. On the other hand, some new schools have opened with better plans for teaching English to the new generation.

As I got a chance to work with English language teaching, I chose an English medium school in my area. I worked with them for three months. That helped me to know about the teaching methods and ways of teaching English language in an English medium school. For completing my internship work I chose NextGen International Coding and Engineering (NICE) school and college.

This report summarizes my experience in observing and conducting classes, skills that I developed while working at the school and ends with some recommendations which are helpful for the institution and anyone who wishes to pursue a teaching career.

CHAPTER 2

[Background & Objective of the Project]

2.1: Background

I was offered the internship course titled Project Paper with Internship (ENG 431) as part of my courses of B.A. (Hons) in English program for which I had to choose NextGen International Coding and Engineering (NICE) School and College to complete my internship. I worked there as a teacher for three months. I gathered enough information about the current situation of ELT and to know the English language teaching techniques in English medium schools. As I worked here as a teacher, I learned about their lesson plan format. Every teacher makes two lesson plans-one is a twenty-two-week lesson plan and another is a yearly lesson plan. They follow the Cambridge lesson plan format. They are using labs for every subject. This is a good practice for the students. They also use English language for teaching all the subjects except Bangla. Most of the dealings of the institution is efficient but they do not give enough attention to Bangla as a core subject. Hopefully, they will recover from this problem.

2.2: Objective of the Project

The objectives of this internship are given below:

CHAPTER 3

[Methodology]

3.1: Selecting the Institution

Selecting an institution has to be one of the hardest jobs when it comes to doing an internship. As I did not get enough time before my internship and from Summer 2022, we can choose banks and other corporate offices besides school, I got confused so many times about what kind of internship will benefit my future career: bank internship, corporate internship, or school internship. Therefore, one of my faculty members suggested a school internship for me as I am a student of English department. So, I took her suggestion and I dropped my CV in many English medium schools. I got selected as a teacher in many schools but I chose NextGen International Coding and Engineering (NICE) School and College. Because this school is closer to my home. This school was established in 2019, but it has already gained some popularity because of its different teaching style and learning system.

3.2: Selecting the Classes

I was selected as a teacher to teach literature in class (V).

3.3: Selecting Facilitators

I got four facilitators during my internship. They helped me a lot when I needed their help. I discussed everything with them before taking the class, making the class materials and lesson plans. They gave me the guidelines for my teaching journey. Whenever I faced any problem, they helped me to figure out the problem.

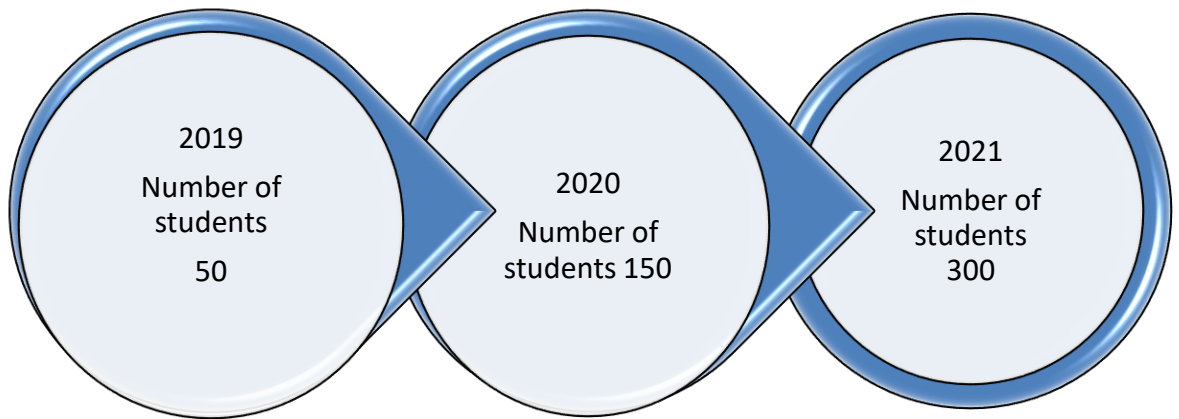

CHAPTER 5

[Internship Activity]

5.1: Class Observation Details

Class-1	<p>I observed my first class on 25th July 2022. The class started at 11:10 am and ended at 11:50 am. The class duration was 40 minutes. Fifteen students were present in class. It was the language class of class five. Ms. Sadia Afrin conducted the class. She was sincere about her class time. She started her class on time and ended her class almost on time. Her class topic was literary device (setting, summary making). She had a good concept about the English literature. She described the things in detail. She maintained the proper interaction with the student. She held the interest of the students from the beginning to the end of the class. She included some fun activities in her lesson. Students were enjoying the class and participating in the activities. She used the CLT method in her teaching. Her teaching materials were PowerPoints and some topic-related fun videos. She took a five minutes quiz to assess the students' learning.</p> <p>She created a classroom environment with her confident personality. Moreover, her voice was clear, her pronunciation was good and she was quite confident. Her class time was spent properly because the lesson was effective. The class duration should be 40 minutes but it was 25 minutes. Twelve students were present in class. It was the literature class of class six. Ms. Suraiya Binte Ratri conducted the class. She was not sincere about her class time. She finished her whole lesson in a rush. Her class topic was The Worst Witch (chapter-2).</p> <p>She was just reading the literature story The Worst Witch from the book. She did not maintain the interaction with the students. There was no activity in her entire class. She did not use any kind of materials for teaching. Even she did not give enough effort to control the class. Students were not enjoying her class. Class-3	<p>I observed my third class on 26th July 2022. The class started at 11:55 am and ended at 12:35 pm. The class duration was 40 minutes. Fourteen students were present in class. It was the literature class of class seven. Ms. Rownok Jahan conducted the class. She was sincere about her class time. She started her class on time and ended her class on time. Her class topic was Charlotte's Web by E.B White (chapter 1). Firstly, she warmed up her students with a relatable story with the text. Then she jumped into the text. She was holding the interest of the students by creating different tones. In the middle of the class, I felt that the students were losing interest in the class. She was trying a lot to keep interacting with the students but she failed.</p> <p>She used some activities but those activities like guessing the word from a random video were not appropriate for the topic. At first, students were enjoying her lesson, but then they lost interest. She used CLT for teaching. Her teaching materials were textbook and video.</p> <p>She took a 5 minutes quiz for assessment.</p> <p>She tried to engage the students but failed. 5.2: Teaching Experience

Class-1

I conducted my first class on 27th July 2022. The class started at 11:10 am and ended at 11:50 am. I took English literature for class five. I was very nervous because it was my first class. I did not enjoy my first class because of my nervousness. My facilitators gave me the literature book of class five beforehand. I prepared a lesson plan for teaching them.

At the beginning of my lesson plan. I set up a warm up activity session. As I was teaching Harry Potter in the class, I asked them about their favorite storybooks. Then I started giving small details of the text and they were connecting the dots of their favorite stories with the text. Then I played a short cartoon summary video of the chapter. That short video summary helped them a lot to understand the storyline. Then I asked questions from the video summary. Everything was going well but because of my nervousness, I missed out some of my lesson points and plans. And I also faced difficulty to turn on the projector. Then I asked them to write the summary of chapter-10 on color paper I gave them. I assessed them with those papers. It was really difficult for me to control the class and teach them at the same time.

At the end of my class, I gave feedback to them and asked them to give me feedback (see Appendices) on my class conduction.

Observer's comments: My observers commented that I was nervous during conducting my class. I was not confident about my lesson plan.

Class-2

I conducted my second class with the same class on 28th July 2022. The class started at 11.10 am and ended at 11:50 am. I was more confident than my last class. I went to the class and wished them good morning. Then I asked them questions from the last class and asked them to predict the story of the chapter I was going to teach them. All of them shared their version of the story. Some of the students were close to the original story.

Then I arranged a group activity on jigsaw. I divided them into four groups. Then I gave each group a part of the story. Groups read their part. One leader from each group went to the other group and collected information about their story part also shared their story part and came back to their group and shared the collected information with their group. In the end, I saw their collected information together and assessed them on their understanding. That activity helped me to assess which group had a better understanding and which group did not understand anything. The students enjoyed the class activity a lot.

My second-class conduction was much better than the first-class conduction.

Observer's comments: My observers commented that I was more confident than my first class and my second was more organized than my first class.

5.3: Working Conditions

I am now working as an English literature teacher at NextGen International Coding and Engineering (NICE) School and College after the internship is over. So, as a teacher, I teach four classes a day. My reporting time is 8.15 am and office time is over at 3.00 pm. Classes start from 8.30 am or 9.15 am.

I have to participate in trainings before taking the class. I have to make a twenty-two-week lesson plan and then a yearly block lesson plan. I also have to make class materials like PowerPoint and worksheets for taking classes. The working place is air-conditioned. I have to provide my study materials through a projector. Sanjeed Bin Eklm is the coordinator of NextGen International Coding and Engineering (NICE) School and College. He guided me throughout my internship. He provided me with all the previous resources that were used for teaching in their schools. He observed all my classes through CCTV footage, called me after the end of the class and corrected all my mistakes. He supervised me throughout my journey. During my internship, I just had to conduct a class by using technology and innovative materials. Then the coordinator pointed out all my mistakes I had done during conducting the class, and I learnt from my mistakes and improved myself every day. There are twenty-five

teachers who are my colleagues. They are conducting different classes. Some of them are conducting programming classes and others are conducting math. There are five teachers teaching English in the school. Two of them are taking language classes of standard I-VII. The other three teachers are taking literature classes like me. All my colleagues are friendly and helpful toward me.

5.4: Skills Developed During the Internship

- **Communication skills:**

I developed my communication skills during the internship. Because most of the time I had to deal with my students, colleagues and parents on regular basis. This regular communication helped me a lot to improve my communication skills.

- **Problem-solving skills:**

My problem-solving skills have improved a lot during my internship. When I was conducting classes, many uncertain problems arose. I had to solve those problems instantly. By solving those student related problems, my problem-solving skill has improved.

- **Time management skills:**

My time management ability has increased by doing my internship because my reporting time is 8.15 am and the end of my office time is 3:00 pm. I had to maintain my class time. I cannot be late for my class. Maintaining time helps me a lot to improve my time management.

- **Decision-making skill:**

I always prepared lesson plans for my classes but during the class, everything does not go according to the lesson plan. So, I had to make instant decisions. That helped me to improve my decision-making skill.

- **Overcome the fear of public speaking:**

Conducting classes helped me a lot to overcome my public speaking fear. I still remember so many times I had enough knowledge about a specific topic or fact but I did not share my knowledge with others for the fear of public speaking. I have overcome my public speaking fear during my internship.

- **Develop my fluency in English:**

As I worked in an English medium school, I have to speak English all the time in my school. So, it is a great practice for improving my fluency. So, I can say that I have developed my fluency during my internship.

- **Develop my idea about new technology:**

In the school, they are using new technology for teaching like IXL, Oxford phonetic app, etc. During my internship, I learnt how to use IXL and how to use Oxford phonetic apps for teaching students. That is the reason I am thinking that my idea about new technology is developed during my internship.

- **Develop my concepts of the Cambridge curriculum:**

I am totally new to teaching. That is the reason why I do not have enough knowledge about the Cambridge curriculum. But during my internship, I have gone through many training sessions that helped me a lot to develop my concepts about the Cambridge curriculum.

- **Develop my professional skills:**

As a fresher, I don't have any idea about professional relationships and professional skills. But during my internship, I had to deal with my colleagues and guardians in a professional way. That helped me to improve my professional skills and also gain knowledge on how to maintain professional relationships.

5.5: Analytical Case Details

During taking the class I have to deal with different kinds of students. Some students are fast learners and some are slow learners. So, I have to identify the different types of learners. Then I have to analyze my lesson plan and implement new things that help the weak or slow learners. Example: In my class Wazi forgets all the long vowel sounds and Apsara knows all of them. So, I cannot treat both of them in the same way. I have to apply one methodology to teach Wazi because he is a slow learner. On the other hand, I have to apply different methodology to teach Apsara because she is a fast learner.

As the school is using task-based teaching method, I have to analyze new tasks according to their age to teach phonetic sounds and literature.

5.6: Learning as an Intern in the Organization

- **Professional communication:**

I have learned professional communication. Before joining the school, I did not have any idea about professional communication. But from my internship period, I had to communicate with my colleagues, parents of my students, and other school staff in a professional way. That helped me to learn professional communication.

- **Taking constructive criticism:**

Before joining the internship, I had a mindset of not taking constructive criticism as a positive thing. Most of the time when people criticized me with constructive criticism, I reacted to them all the time. When I joined my workplace, firstly, I was feeling frustrated with constructive criticism. After some time, I had realized that without constructive criticism I cannot overcome my shortcomings. So, I have learned how to take constructive criticism in a positive way.

- **Lesson plan and block lesson:**

I had no idea about making lesson plans. I learned how to make proper lesson plan after getting the guidance of my coordinator. During my internship, I got a proper and clear idea about the Cambridge lesson plan, and also learnt how to make detailed lesson plan and block lesson plan.

- **Work under pressure:**

During my university life I had a conception that as I completed all my assignments on time, I have the ability to work under pressure. But I was absolutely wrong. I had realized the original meaning of work under pressure in my workplace. New day new challenge, I learned to deal with pressure and make a balance between personal life and work life.

- **Maintain the gesture:**

Maintaining positive gesture is very important for teachers. If I stand like a robot, students will not enjoy my class. During my internship, I learned to control my nervousness and keep perfect gestures during class.

CHAPTER 6

[Limitations of the Internship]

6.1: Limitations of the Internship

- **Lack of time:**

Because of Eid holidays I did not get enough time to observe the classes. I just got a chance to observe three classes. After observing the three classes, I started taking classes. Because of the short time I could not prepare myself for the class. I could give my best if I got enough time during my internship.

- **Lack of confidence:**

I suffered a lot for lack of confidence during my internship. Sometimes I felt blank, confused in the classroom because of lack of confidence. Because of low confidence I got into difficult situations during teaching. As a teacher I needed confidence to teach my students. It was my biggest limitation during the internship.

- **Lack of communication:**

I faced a communication issue during my internship. During my internship I needed to communicate with parents besides students. I felt a little bit difficult to communicate with the parents of the students.

- **Lack of confidential data:**

I faced some problems during my internship for lack of confidential data. When I joined the school firstly some colleagues were not interested to share the previous records with me. It was difficult for me to conduct class without those records for the first fifteen days.

CHAPTER 7

[Observations and Findings]

7.1: Overall Findings

Use of English Language:

All the teachers use English language in their classroom. In the school, they were advertising that they taught English language to their student as a first language. But all the teachers learned English as a second language so they did not have the foreign proficiency as native speakers. That is a finding that the school is teaching English as a first language with some second-language speakers.

Facilities for Students:

- **Lab Facilities:**

The school has three labs:

1. Computer lab
2. Robotic Lab
3. Lego Lab

Students can use the lab during lab classes.

- **Class Facilities:**

All classrooms are airconditioned and have smart touchscreen boards. All classrooms have projectors. The authority always monitors all the classes through CCTV cameras.

- **Co-curricular Activities**

Students have the facilities to do music class and art/craft class in the school besides the academic subjects.

- **Scholarship Facilities:**

All students have the facility to enjoy a 65% waiver during admission.

Lack of Facilities:

- **Lack of Library Facilities:**

There is a small library. But the library does not have enough books for the students.

- **Lack of Classrooms:**

If the number of students increases, the school will fail to provide them with enough classrooms.

- **Lack of School Environment:**

The school is located in a commercial building. No matter how comfortable the classrooms are, the school does not have a big library, field, etc. The school does not have the necessary school environment.

- **Lack of Lab Assistant:**

During taking lab classes there is no lab assistant. It is very difficult for the teacher to take the lab class without a lab assistant.

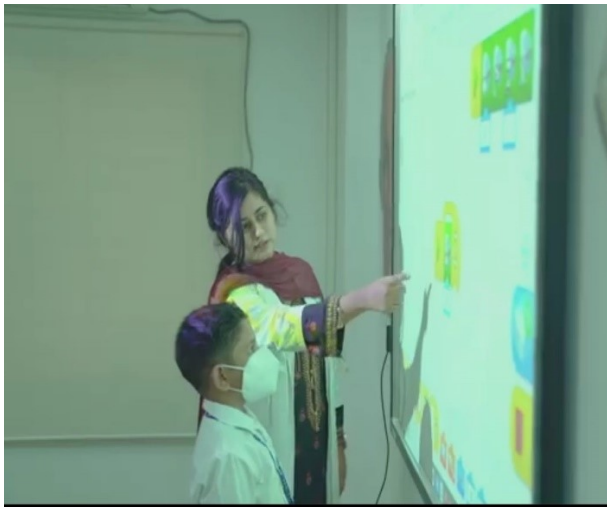

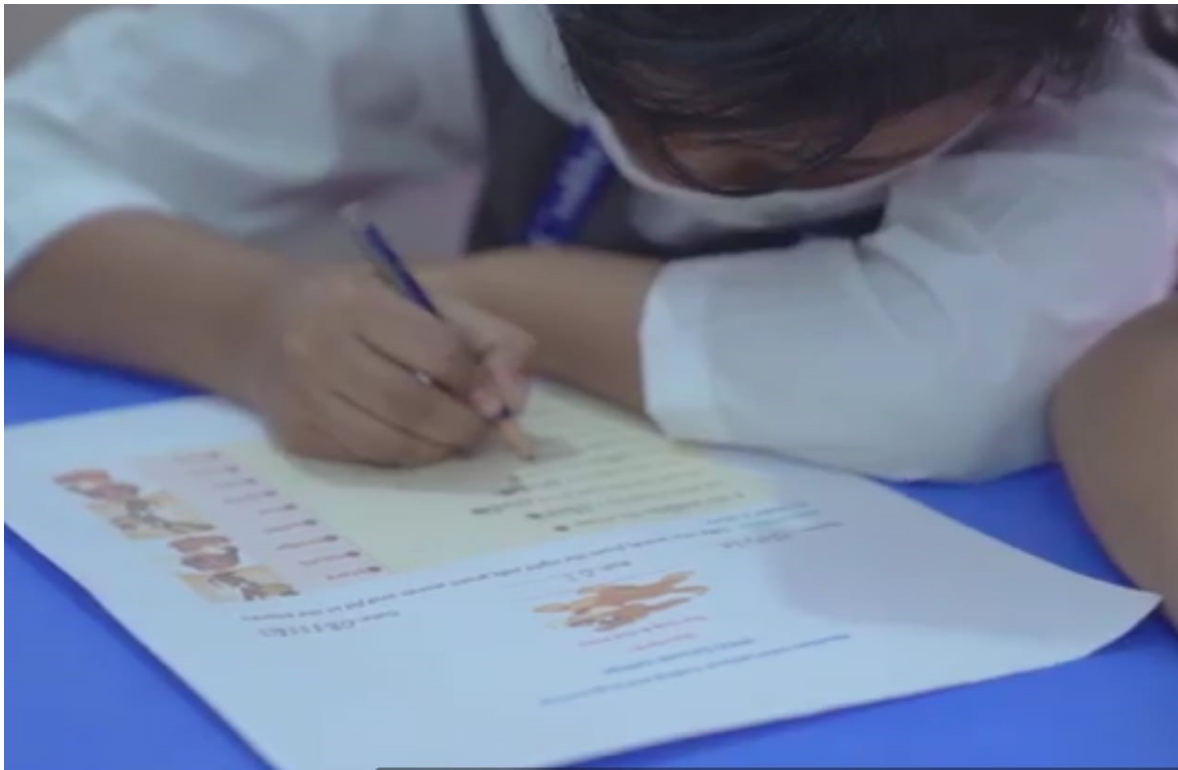

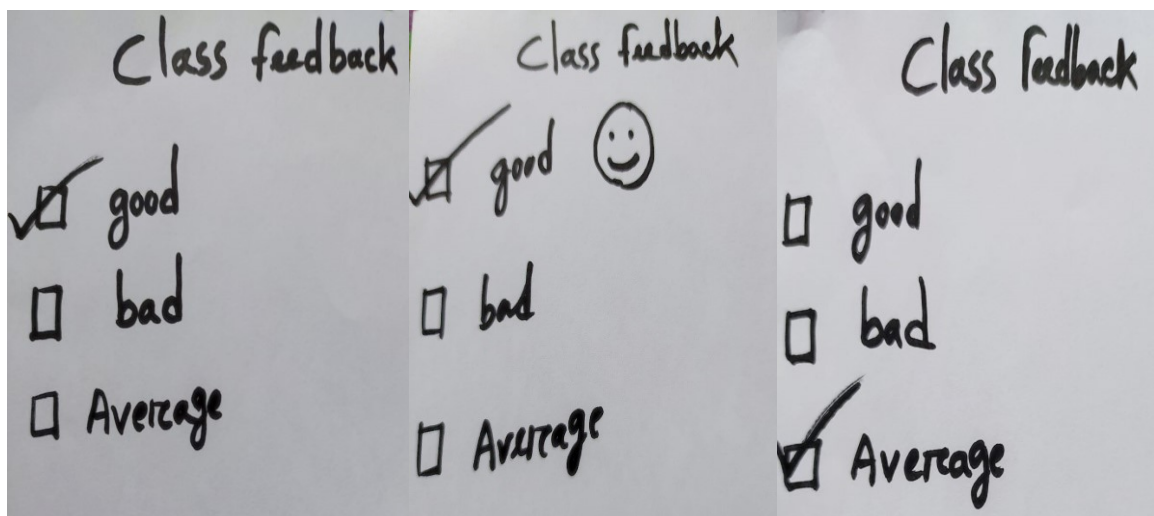
