


Chapter One

Introduction

1.1 Background of the Organization

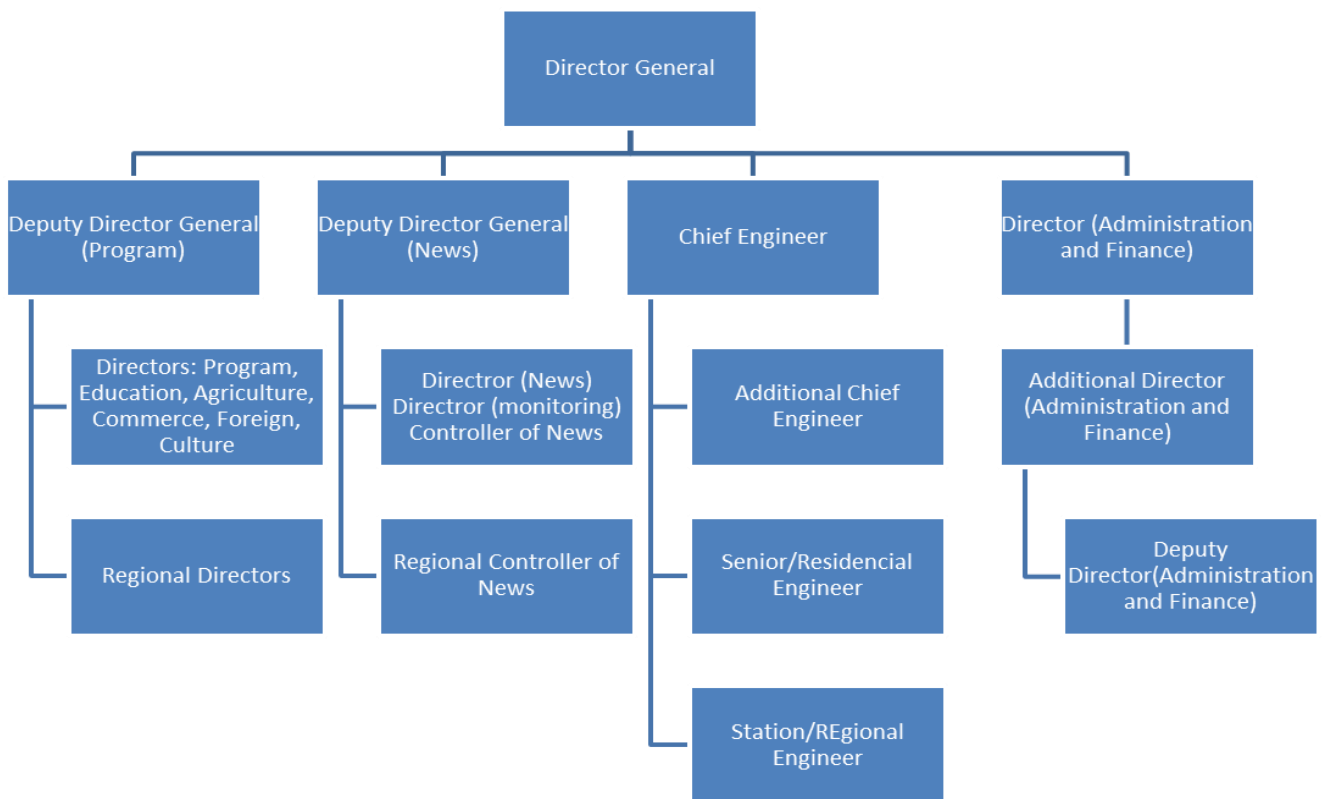
Bangladesh Betar is the **state-owned** radio broadcasting organisation of Bangladesh which was previously known as **Radio Bangladesh** between 1975 and 1996.

Radio transmission in the locality started in Dhaka on **December 16, 1939** to distribute the news of the **World War II** all over India and the then British Raj introduced **six radio stations** under the 'All India Radio' (the then national public radio broadcaster of India). A house was rented at the Nazimuddin Road of the Old Dhaka (present Shaikh Burhanuddin Post Graduate College) and the first ever radio station of Bangladesh started its journey. The broadcasting house consisted of only **two studios** and a 5 kilowatt medium wave transmitter was installed in Kallyanpur. Although, formally it was called 'All India Radio Dhaka', it was familiar as the '**Dhaka Dhwani Bistar Kendra**' to the people of this locality. Then the station was later relocated to Shahbag. It manoeuvred an important role during the Liberation War of Bangladesh of 1971. On March 26, 1971, the broadcasting centre of Radio Pakistan was used to transmit the declaration of independence. Through the war, it was known as **Swadhin Bangla Betar Kendra** (Independent Bengal Radio Station). On December 6, it was renamed as Bangladesh Betar. Currently, the station is shifted to Agargaon.

Now, in 2018, Bangladesh Betar is still the only state-owned radio station, transmitting all over the country, even in the remotest areas. Starting from 7 AM in the morning till 12:10 AM in the midnight, Bangladesh Betar broadcasts **22 bulletins** in total in Bangla and English, rendering the listeners with the **most accurate** news.

1.2 What is internship?

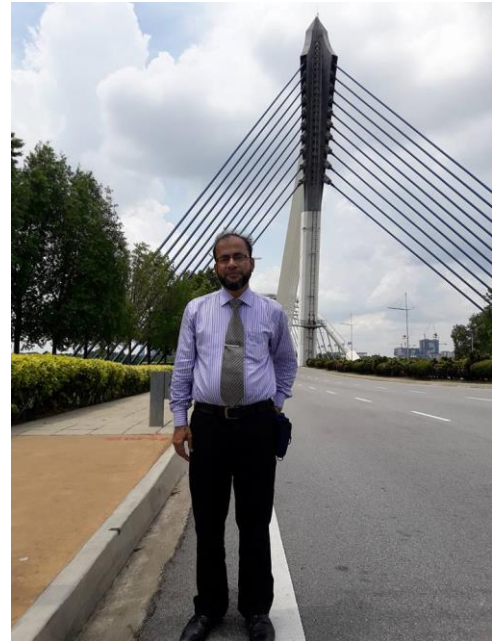

As a student of this discipline, one may learn how to gather news, conduct an interview, compile the facts, write it in a formal polished fashion etc. but without field experience, these academic knowledge cannot be honed. That is why internship is very important for a student of Journalism and Mass Communication before they enter job market.

1.3 Background of my internship

Bangladesh Betar is the only **state-owned** radio station. Betar has a glorified past and the most subscription in the country. Although, listeners in the capital and big cities and towns are more likely to listen to the private FM radio channels, in rural areas and remotest areas, specially in coastal belt and mid sea, Betar is still no. 1 choice for the listeners for news, particularly on their weather updates. Although Bangladesh Betar is a state-owned broadcasting centre and they only air the news seem fit and do not go against the interest of the state, they are never wrong on disseminating wrong information. With the help of trusted journalists and the controllers of news, with heavy cross-checking, they always broadcast the finest news. The controllers of news are highly experienced and are the top recruits. All the officers in Bangladesh Betar are BCS Cadres, which is the most prestigious and lucrative Government job. I knew that they had much to offer and I had a lot to learn from them. It also gave me an idea on how a state-owned broadcasting body works. And also Bangladesh Betar is a highly equipped organisation that has been broadcasting news and programmes for decades. So, when I got the chance to be an intern in this organisation, I didn't second guess myself and joined the central newsroom.

1.4 About my Supervisor

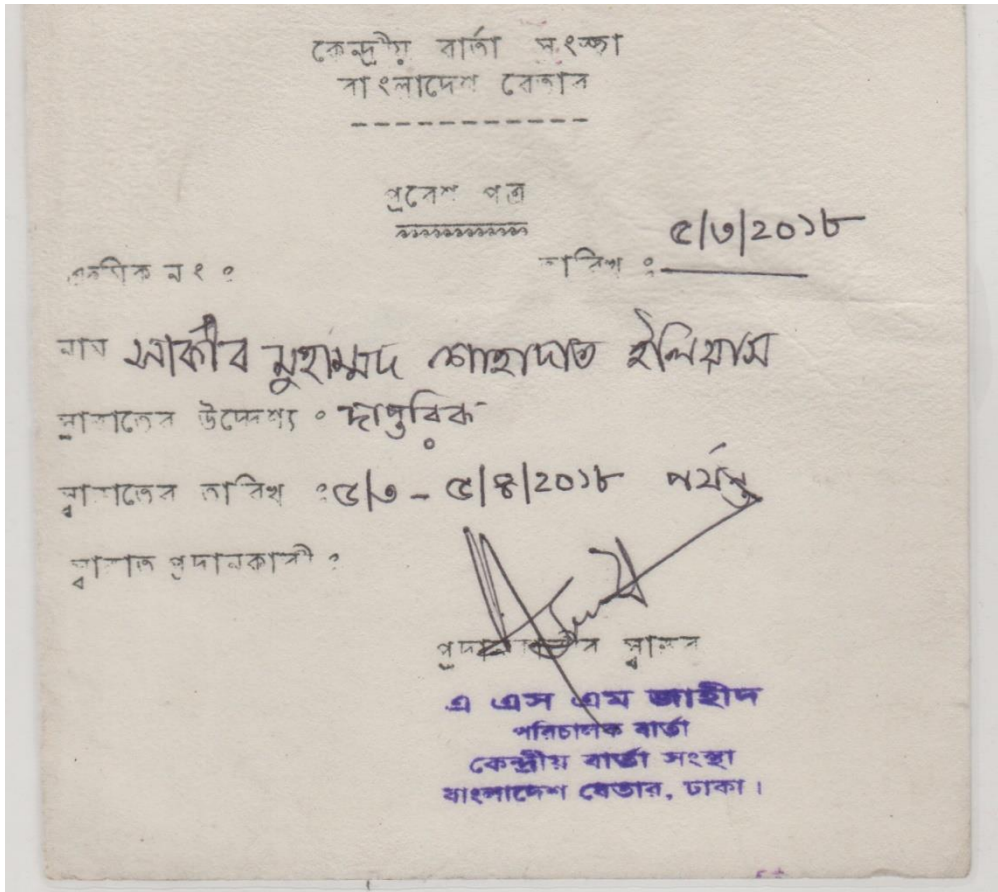
Hailing from Patuakhali, Mr. Abdul Houqe studied in Bangladesh Agricultural University and University of Tromsø, Norway before he joined in Bangladesh Civil Service. He was formerly an Assistant Regional Manager in Bangladesh Betar, Sylhet and later promoted as the Director of Liaison at Bangladesh Betar, Dhaka. Mr. Houqe is a knowledge seeker, kind hearted person and a great mentor. Under his observation, my working days in Bangladesh Betar became more fruitful.



1.5 Duration of the internship

My internship started in Mid February of 2018 and ended on 30 April of 2018, completing 10(ten) weeks of mandatory internship period. I have attended in the central newsroom in the weekdays in different shifts. There are 3(three) shifts in the central newsroom, first shift is from 5AM to 11AM, second shift from 11AM till 5PM and the last and final shift is from 5PM to 12:10 AM.

I was mostly assigned to work in between the first 2 shifts and to cope with the night shift I was appointed in the evening shift as well.

Week 2: 22 February 2018 – 28 February, 2018

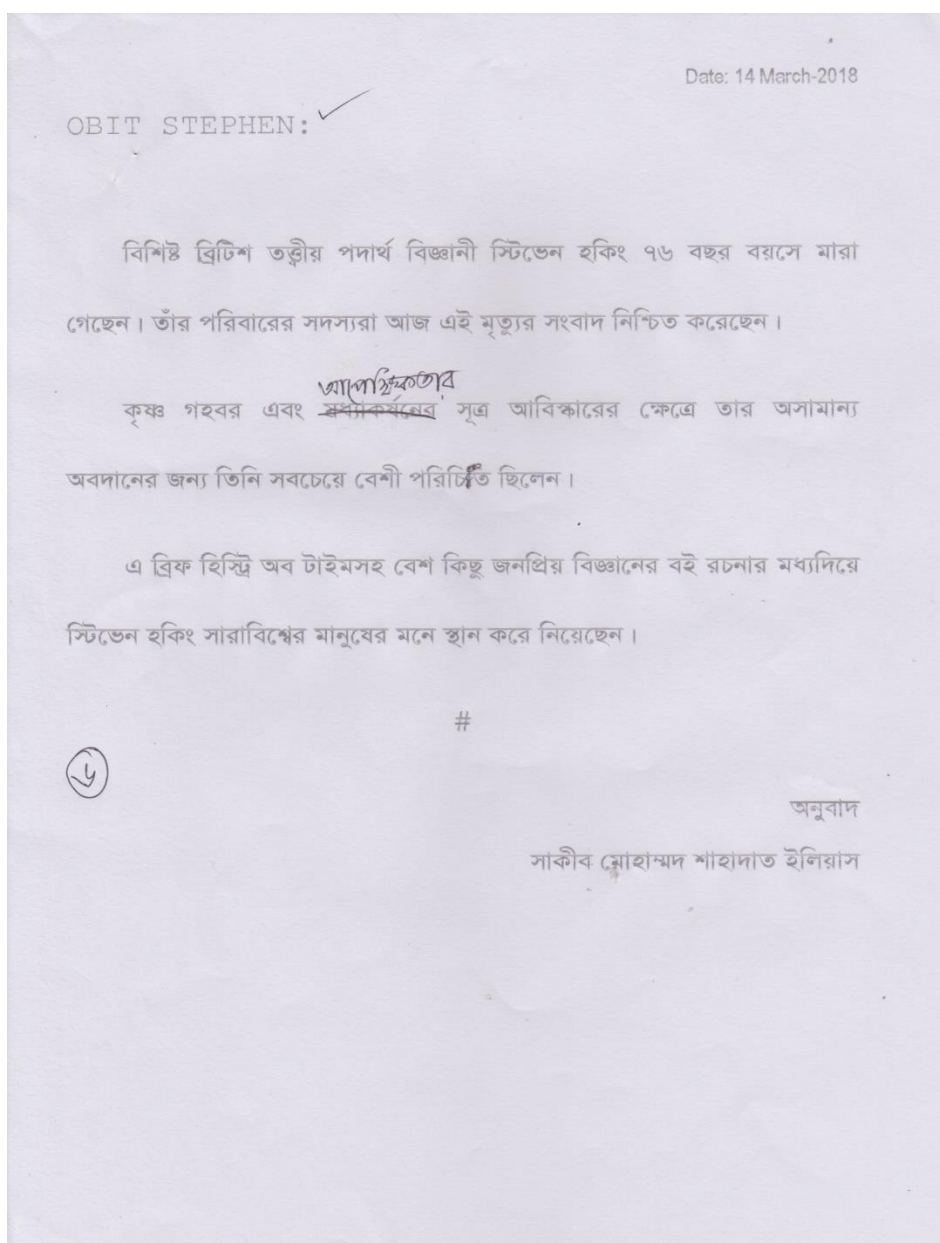
- Was advised to watch and learn how controllers edit news from different news agencies like BSS, BBC, Xinhua ect.

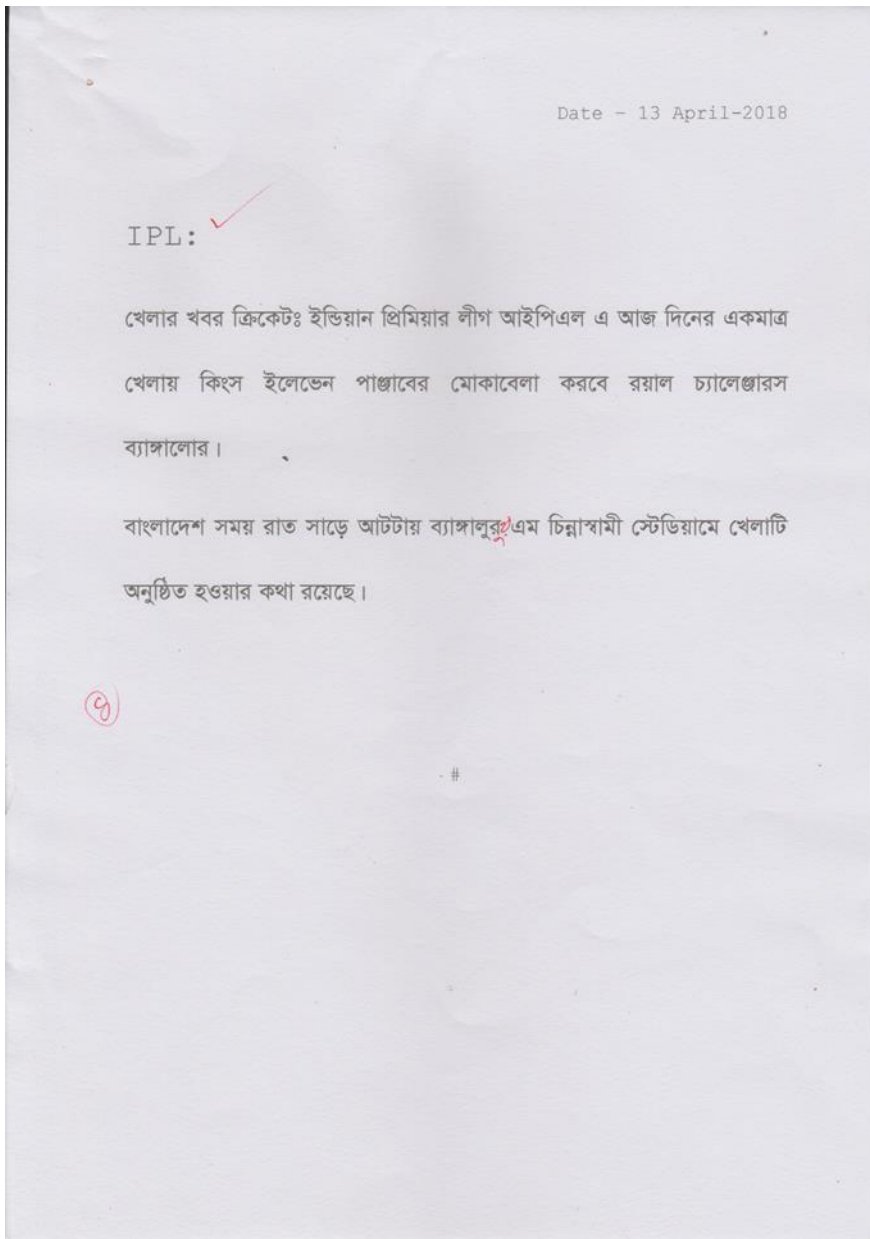

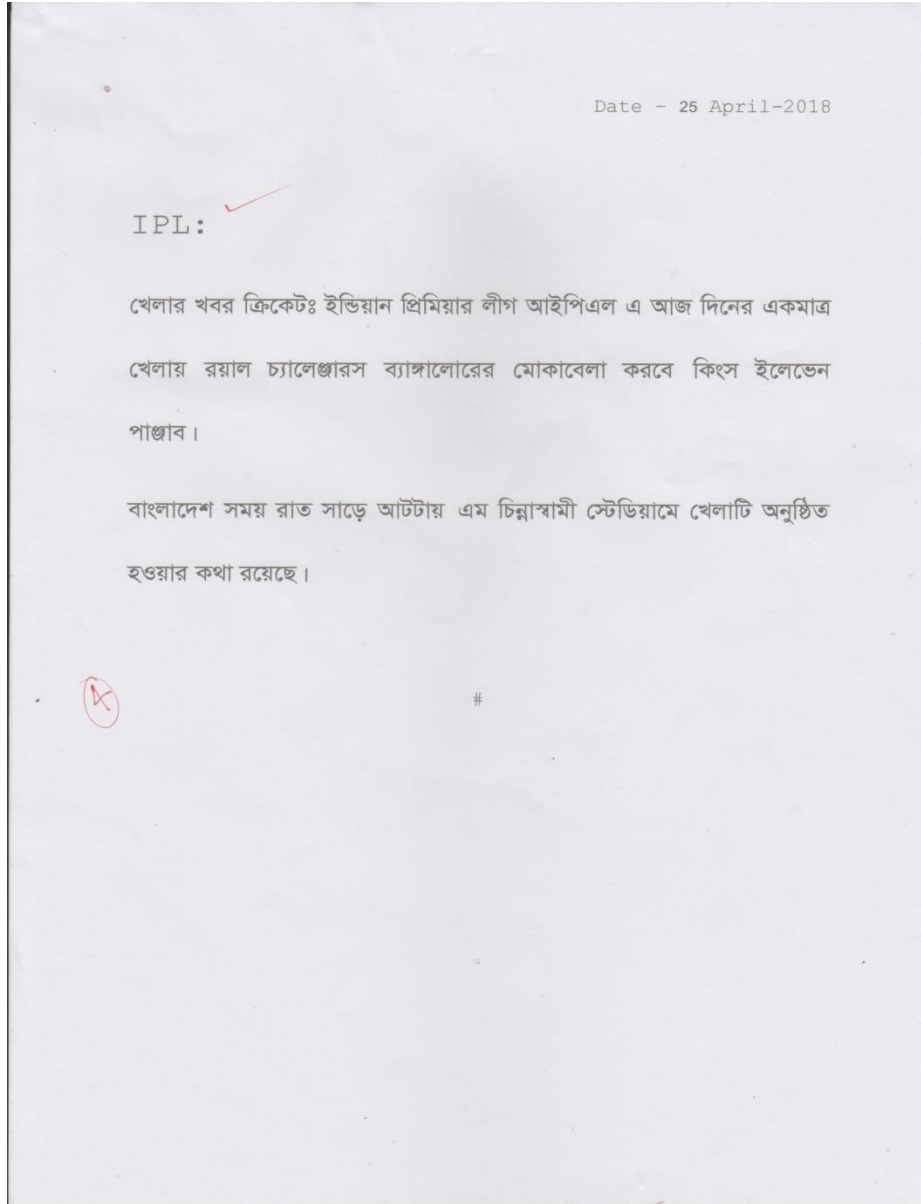

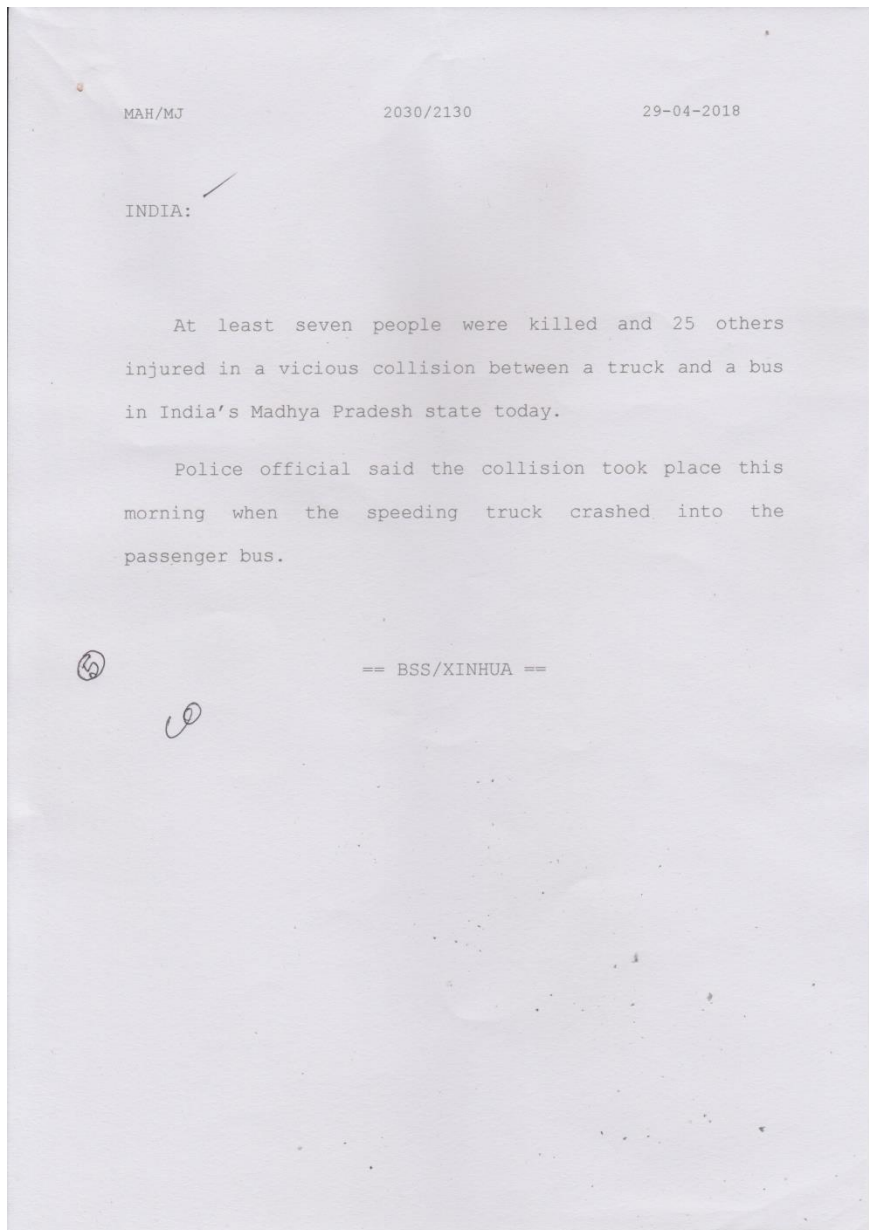

CHAPTER THREE
LEARNING AND EXPERIENCE

3.1. Knowledge gathering/ learning

During my internship at Bangladesh Betar, I edited and translated news from different sources and agencies. In this process, I had gathered knowledge on various aspects of news and editing and translating news. Knowledge that I had gathered during my internship are listed below

- **Editing News** – At university, I've learnt how to edit news. Although, it was a practical based course, I didn't really have field experience. The time I spent at Bangladesh Betar, I came to know about the fundamental aspects of copy editing and the immense responsibilities of an editors(Controllers at Betar). Controllers are responsible for the clarity and accuracy of content that is aired on radio. While I was working in the central newsroom, I was advised to check Bangla spelling mistakes as well as grammatical ones. And then, one of the controllers would final check before it those news were aired.

- **Learning about news** – As a freshman, I have very little practical knowledge/experience about news making, writing, editing for broadcasting media. That is why I followed the footsteps of the controllers how to gather news and write. My supervisor Mr. Houqe advised me to read daily newspapers, monitoring report from Bangladesh Betar Monitoring Cell and was advised to listen to the bulletins of Bangladesh Betar to understand the formatting of the news aired by them.

- **Practical Experience** – I have learned hand to hand editing process from the controllers of news and the translators. Sometimes I was advised to translate and edit news or part of a news to include in a bigger news and then the controllers would check them for errors.

3.2 Tools and technologies used

There were not much tools to use in the central newsroom, I didn't have any specific cubicle, chair or table. I had to roam where the work lead me. And, I only used pen, papers, pencils and sometimes dictionaries to find out different spelling of different words. I also had to use my phone (LG G5) to access internet to get news as Betar does not only take news items from different news agencies but also from various legit online news portals.

3.3 Special experience

To be an intern at Bangladesh Betar itself was a special experience for me. Bangladesh Betar is not necessarily open on offering internships. Some of the engineering students get chance to visit Betar as a part of their industrial training in the engineering cell but newsroom intern is a very rare opportunity and I was overwhelmed to get this internship.

This apart, the employees at Betar are necessarily all BSC Cadres, in news department all are Communication Cadres. And all the employees were very kind, friendly and helpful to me understanding various aspects of news, hierarchy and other systems and they also treated me as one of their own.

I was honoured with such behaviour and hospitality and I also felt at home around these people, which I am greatly thankful for.

CHAPTER FOUR
EVALUATION OF LEARNING

4.1. Academic learning and practical work

Bachelor's of Journalism and Mass Communication in Daffodil International University offers many courses on report writing, editing, copy writing and advance courses on these as well. And also courses on Mass Communication where we get to learn about communication patterns, communication in different places or with different type of (focus) groups. And different teachers had taught us from their very own perspectives as they have worked in different platforms at some stage of their lives. So, if not compiled the knowledge, mundane students would suffer to understand the whole of it.

We learnt about the newsroom and field, and were sent to different institution and programmes to observe, note and report but that is not really enough to understand how things work in the real life. That is where the internship comes. When I came to Bangladesh Betar, I started to learn how the news runs here, they gets the most accurate news and they cross-check everything. Without being sure about something they wouldn't air any news. While a lot of prominent newspapers are opening online portals and there are already some established online portal in the country operating with great agility, Bangladesh Betar is somewhat slower than them which we have always criticised. Working there for the time being taught me that they are more into accuracy than losing credibility by airing any unconfirmed news without fact checking by the controller(s).

Most of the learning was similar to my learning at university from the course, but sometimes the delivery was different as not everyone was taught by the same teacher of practice everything in the same manner.

Working with them really made huge impact in my learning.

4.2. Expectation and outcome

Truth to be told, I didn't have much of an expectation. We all believe in a notion that Bangladesh Betar is quite late while disseminating news, they air the same news again and again, and their presentation is boring. Although, I still agree with the last one at some extents but the other blames are utterly invalid. Joining here, I have seen how the news is been edited and added news information or trimmed every hour. The central newsroom is a literal war-zone, where controllers are lieutenants, captains and warriors compiling, writing, editing, trimming and polishing every news to air. The rush is captivating, heart pumping. The environment is so amazing that how every hour goes by, one cannot really know. It was quite a ride for me and one that I shall always remember.

4.3. Skills developed during my internship

Throughout my 11(eleven) semester at Daffodil International University, studying in Journalism and Mass Communication has taught me a lot about writing, editing news and quite a lot about mass communication as well. But as I previously mentioned, studying is not complete without practical knowledge and skills. This is exactly why internship is important. In an internship, we get to know how to work in a field or in a newsroom or in human resources and communication sectors.

All these studies leads to a job or entrepreneurship. But for that, we need to understand how the an organisation works. And internship helps us out to bridge the gap between classroom knowledge and practical knowledge. And my internship was not different than that at all.

I have already learned about gathering, compiling, writing, editing and polishing news. But working here honed my ability to do the thing I have learned in last few years in my university courses.

4.4. How this experience will help me in my future career

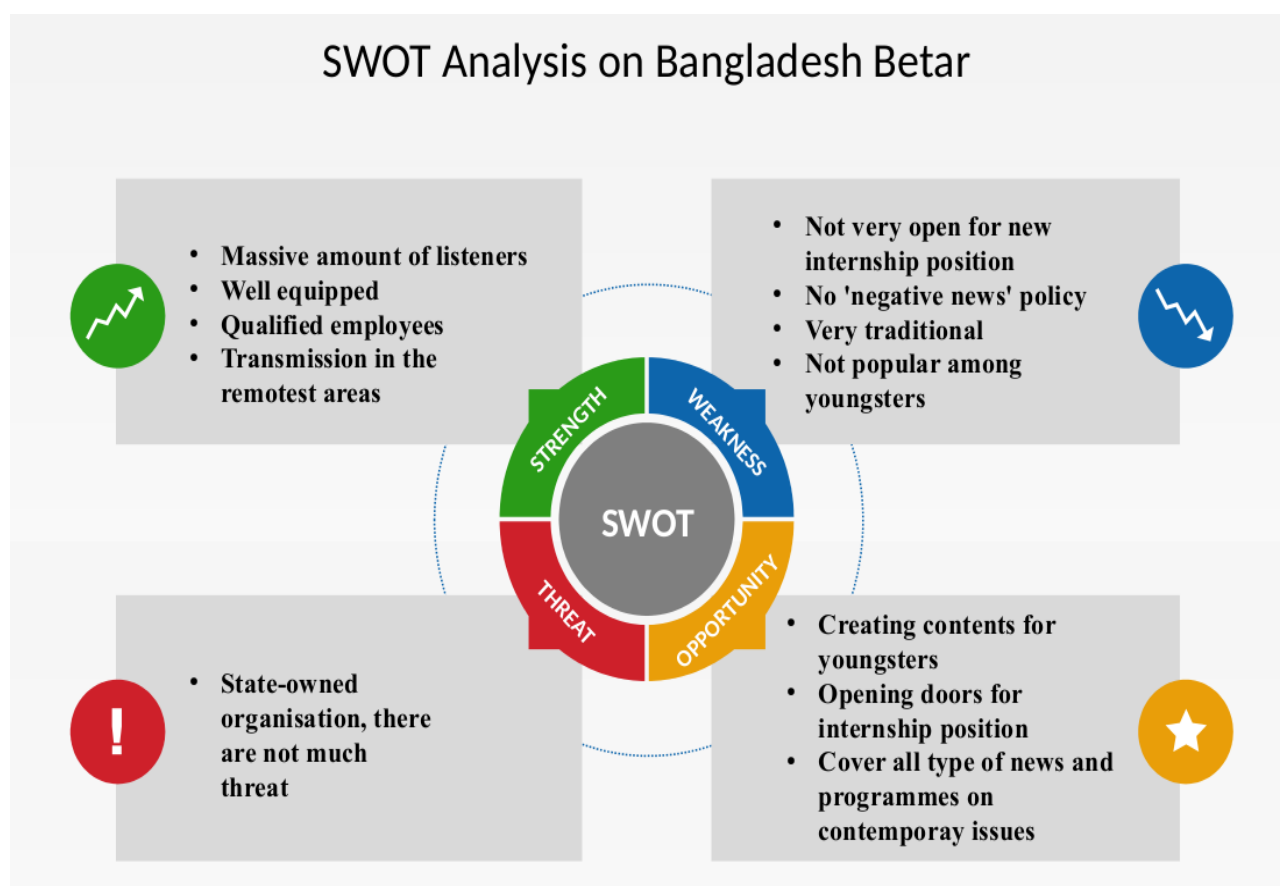

Almost all the employees are Bangladesh Civil Service(BCS) Cadres. Thus, they are highly qualified and they are humble and very friendly.

Although, Betar doesn't essentially take interns, I was very lucky to land an internship there. And it changed my way of seeing government organisations. A lot of us, we have misconception that a government organisation is a place where no work is done properly. (If possible) I urge these people to visit the central newsroom and stay there for an hour or two to observe how it runs, because it does not stop. 22 bulletins in a day, broadcasting all accurate news is not a very easy task.

So, my recommendation is, if anyone gets a chance to be an intern in this organisation, s/he would take the chance without giving it a second thought. But one thing for sure, if someone wants to learn, s/he can learn it from anywhere, but need to work hard.

Conclusion

Internship is a basically the road to someone's career. One get to know the applications and opportunities of their theoretical studies of the recent past. Internship is an opportunity to explore one's relevant field without the fear of falling down as it is a phase of learning and everyone is there to help. One can make as many mistakes at this period of time (which is not advised, at all) and ask a lot of questions about anything and everything and everyone usually is happy to answer all the queries.
